Grades and Credits



- Students take 7 classes each semester.
- Each class is worth $\frac{1}{2}$ credit, and a student must pass the class (with a grade of A, B, C, or D) to receive the credit.
- Students must pass English and Math each semester to promote to the next grade.
- A student should earn 7 credits each year (3.5 credits per semester).
- Students must earn at least 22 credits to earn a high school diploma.

What's the biggest difference from Middle School?



- Must pass classes (earn at least a D) to earn credit
- If students do not earn credit for the semester, they will have to retake the entire course **over the summer**
- Will not be promoted to 10th grade without passing classes.

Semester Grade Calculation:

- **MP1% + MP2% divided by 2 = semester grade**
- **EX: MP1 85% B + MP2 65% D = 150 divided by 2**
- **Semester grade= 75% C**

Our Goal for 9th Graders

- Be on track for graduation by meeting grade level requirements: **passing Math, English, History, Biology**

MCPS Graduation Requirements at a Glance

THE STATE OF MARYLAND AUTHORIZES 1 DIPLOMA for all high school graduates, based upon successful fulfillment of four categories of requirements: enrollment, course credit, student service learning (SSL), and Maryland Comprehensive Assessments (MCA). Students must satisfactorily complete four years beyond Grade 8 to meet the enrollment requirement unless an alternative enrollment plan is developed and a waiver is approved as outlined in regulation ISB-RA. All other requirements are summarized in the table below. Please consult the online MCPS Course Bulletin for 2025–2026 at coursebulletin.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/Home/PlanningTools or your school counselor for further information.

COMPUTER SCIENCE, ENGINEERING OR TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION (TE)	1 credit designated TE. Courses satisfying this requirement are designated in the course bulletin and includes the study of computers and algorithmic processes or the application of knowledge, tools, and skills to solve practical problems and extend human capabilities.	
ENGLISH	4 credits of organized instruction in comprehension of literary and informational texts, writing, speaking and listening, language, and literacy, of which 1 credit shall be aligned with the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment (MCA) for English.

RM Grading Policy: Due Date, Deadline Policy

BY DUE DATE (No Points Off)	BY DEADLINE (Late: 10% Off)	AFTER DEADLINE (0%)
--------------------------------	--------------------------------	------------------------

- Teachers set a due date for each assignment/assessment
- Deadlines are always 5 days after the due date
- If the due date passes, teachers assign a “Z” for students who have not submitted work. (Z communicates a student can still turn in the assignment)
- Assignments turned in after the due date and before the deadline receive a 10% late penalty.
- If the deadline passes, Zs will be changed to zeros
- 50% can be earned based on quality of work

Example in StudentVue Gradebook: PA: Biology Cells Assignment (Due: 9/15/25; Deadline: 9/22/25)

RM Grading Policy

- Minimum of 2 All Task Reassessments per Marking Period
 - Teacher will identify and Indicate with an “R” in gradebook assignment title
- Feedback:
 - Zs in gradebook indicate a missing assignment prior to the deadline
 - Graded work will be returned within 10 days of the due date
 - Late work will be returned within 10 days of the deadline
- Semester Grade Calculations:
 - **MP1% + MP2% divided by 2 = semester grade**
 - **EX: MP1 85% B + MP2 65% D = 150 divided by 2**
 - **Semester grade= 75% C**

Rocket Refresh as Intervention or Enrichment

- Rocket Refresh is a pause in new instruction.
- Allows time for intervention, re-teaching, re-assessment, or enrichment

- **MP2:** 11/12/25, 12/3/25, 12/17/25, 1/14/26

- **MP4:** 4/29/26, 5/13/26, 6/3/26


Academic Supports at RM

Safety and Building Expectations

Students will enter through the main entrance, the auditorium entrance or the track entrance.

- Students will receive a student ID and will be **required to show their ID when they enter the building.** Reprints cost \$5.
- Students should not hold or open exterior doors for other students---this creates potential safety issues.



Safety and Building Expectations Hallways

- Students will sign out using an E-hallpass system.
- Students without passes in the hallway will receive escalating consequences:
 - 1st: warning
 - 2nd: call home
 - 3rd: lunch detention
 - 4th: in-school intervention
 - More: parent conference





All 9th and 10th grade students participate in the IB Middle Years Programme in all subjects.

IB informs how we organize ourselves as a school in many ways.



What's MYP?

- The MYP is a balanced, holistically focused curriculum that uses an inquiry model to build conceptual understanding.
- Focus of 9th grade is building skills, habits and competencies that support success.

What to expect

- School wellbeing focus will continue to be guided by IB principles and Approaches to Learning.


