





WHAT IS A TYPICAL DAY AT ROCKVILLE HS?

- First period begins at 7:45 am (students should be here by 7:30am!)
- School gets out at 2:30 pm (activity buses leave at 4:25 for ECAs)
- We have one lunch - 40 minutes long
 - We do NOT have an open lunch
- Many academic/elective classes are mixed by grade level
- Classes are 47 minutes with 5 minutes for class transitions
- Wednesdays – 36 minute Wellness Wednesday class

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 4 credits of English
- 4 credits of Math, including Algebra and Geometry
- 3 credits of Social Studies, including US History, NSL Government and Modern World History
- 3 credits of NGSS* Aligned Science, including a Life Science, Physical Science, and Earth Space
- 2 credits in World Language or 4 credits in a Program of Study
- 1 credit of Fine Arts
- 1 credit of Physical Education
- 1 credit of Health Education
- 1 credit of Technology Education
- 2 credits in any electives



CHOOSING THE RIGHT COURSES

- We offer many courses during registration; however, only courses meeting a minimum level of interest will run.
- Our staffing is determined by course requests made by students.
- Decisions about courses and hiring staff begin in March.
- AP and IB: The IB program and courses start in 11th Grade. Some AP options are available in 9th.
- Strongly consider the Programs of Study (POS) opportunities offered.
- Consider challenges and new experiences


WHAT ARE PATHWAYS AND PROGRAMS OF STUDY?

COURSE REGISTRATION


- ❑ Students will be able to register for courses using their StudentVue account at home with their parent/guardian.
- ❑ The online registration window will ONLY be opened from January 14th to February 3rd.
- ❑ Students will meet with a RHS Counselor on February 4th to review course selections.

All 9th graders need to take a total of 7 courses per semester.


- Honors English 9A and B


