WHEREAS, In 1997, the first national "Walk to School Day" was sponsored in Chicago and, in 2000, the first international "Walk to School Day" was celebrated; and

WHEREAS, East Silver Spring Elementary School was the first MCPS school to sponsor a local "Walk to School Day"; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 25,000 children are injured as pedestrians by motor vehicles each year; and

WHEREAS, Hundreds of children could be saved from injury and death each year if every community took steps to make pedestrian safety a priority, to teach children about pedestrian safety, and to become aware of the difficulties and dangers that children face on their trip to school or the bus stop each day; and

WHEREAS, Obesity rates among children have more than doubled in the past twenty years, according to the National Longitudinal Study of Youth; and

WHEREAS, Parents and community leaders again are joining together nationwide to walk children to school or to the bus stop to promote pedestrian safety in their community and, also, to promote physical fitness; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the Board of Education proclaim October 8, 2003, "Walk to School Day"; and be it further

<u>Resolved</u>, That the superintendent of schools notify the community and school population of "Walk to School Day," publicize this resolution and the school system's participation through a press release and an article in the *Bulletin*, and encourage everyone to consider the safety of pedestrians – and, in particular, student walkers – every day.

RESOLUTION NO. 491-03 Re: **ADMINISTRATION OF MARYLAND SCHOOL ASSESSMENT**

On motion of Mrs. O'Neill and seconded by Ms. Cox, the following resolution was adopted unanimously:

WHEREAS, The Maryland School Assessment (MSA) is to be administered during the period of February 25, 2004-March 5, 2004, to students in grades 3 to 8 in reading and mathematics and to students in grade 10 in reading; and

WHEREAS, The MSA represents high-stakes testing to comply with the requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act for school districts to demonstrate Adequate Yearly Progress; and

WHEREAS, Under the best of circumstances, the administration of these proficiency tests in late February and early March leaves a limited amount of time for principals and teachers to prepare students to complete the MSA successfully; and

WHEREAS, The critical loss of instructional days caused by Hurricane Isabel, which necessitated a state of emergency to be declared for the State of Maryland, further

impedes the good-faith efforts of local school districts to achieve proficiency; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the Montgomery County Board of Education request the Maryland Association of Boards of Education, convening next week for its annual meeting, to adopt a resolution requesting the state superintendent and state board of education to postpone this year's administration of the MSA to a later date, to be determined after consultation with local boards and local superintendents, and to consider a later date for administration of the MSA in future years.

Re: **BOARD/SUPERINTENDENT COMMENTS**

Dr. Weast commented on the power outage during Hurricane Isabel. It was very frustrating for employees, parents, and students. Since the start of school, there have been closures due to storm-related damage and electrical problems.

Dr. Weast reported that 145 students from MCPS have been named semifinalists in the 2004 National Merit Scholarship competition, an increase of 27 semifinalists over the previous year. The local students represent 44 percent of the 329 semifinalists in Maryland. They will compete with about 16,000 students nationally for some 8,000 Merit Scholarships to be announced next spring.

Ms. Cox reported that she attended the First Annual Congressional Conference on Civic Education. The highlight was a performance of former eighth graders from Robert Frost Middle School who gave a presentation on a mock congressional hearing on the role and responsibilities of citizenship.

Mr. Lange commented that he attended with other Board members the Olde Towne Days in Gaithersburg where they witnessed the swearing in of 49 new citizens.
