The Board of Education of Montgomery County met in special session at the Carver Educational Services Center, Rockville, Maryland, on Thursday, November 8, 2007, at 5:00 p.m.

The Board of Education met with the Executive Board of SEIU Local 500 and discussed uniting the voices of 17,000 child-care providers, Head Start employees, Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) support staff professionals, special needs providers, and university faculty for a lifetime of learning.

SEIU Local 500 presented the viewpoints and visions of other bargaining units.

- ♦ Child-care providers highlighted the care of young children and their contribution to early childhood education
- Special education providers spoke about the community collaboration with the school system since there are residential, school, and vocational components
- Higher education processionals underscored the idea of meeting the needs of children at all levels

The conversation centered on child-care providers, and their impact on children's learning and preparedness for school. There was a hope that, through licensing and training, the community-based organizations could be aligned with the school system. Furthermore, there is a need to work with other agencies in an intergovernmental outreach such as Health and Human Services. There is a possibility that the school system could offer technical assistance for a more comprehensive approach to child care.

The superintendent thought that MCPS could provide information on what students need to know when entering kindergarten as well as age-appropriate activities. MCPS could put

together specific tapes to educate children on a specific skill set.

As a wrap up to the meeting, it was suggested that a work group be formed to study services in Montgomery County and a way to integrate services to children.

The meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
