The Board of Education met with the Executive Board of SEIU Local 500 and discussed the Career Development and Educational Improvement Committee's Workplace English Program.

The discussion that ensued highlighted the following thoughts—

- Civil rights classes could be initiated in all middle schools since students do not know what they do not know.
- Overall, students' language is offensive should be addressed.
- If students are confronted for their inappropriate language, staff should be supported by administration.
- With everyone looking at suspension rates, what can staff do?
- This is a good topic to put on the table.
- Montgomery County Region , Maryland Association of Student Councils is working on this and could offer videos or mini courses.
- Somehow the message needs to get to students that rude language is not acceptable.
- Culture of Respect must be emphasized with students.
- Some words should not be tolerated and students should be confronted when feasible.
- MCPS should establish standards with an expectation that all will comply.
- Nothing changes overnight and everyone must be patient.

In conclusion, The Board president stated that the Board hears the frustration of staff and has started the conversation at the Board table.
