# Dear MCPS Community:

Thank you for a successful fall preseason. As we gear up for opening night on September 2, here are some important program updates and reminders:

## **Spirited Sportsmanship & Spectator Safety Week**

Beginning this year, MCPS Athletics will be celebrating <u>Spirited Sportsmanship & Spectator Safety Week</u> during the first week of each season. This week will highlight our R.A.I.S.E. core values, including respect, sportsmanship, and spirited and safe competition. We invite all of MCPS Sports Nation to join us in proactively celebrating the positive aspects of participation and expectations for those who attend our events. ## **Certified Athletic Trainer Shortage**

MCPS has secured vendors to provide an athletic trainer for all high schools; however, as of September 1, only 16 of 25 high schools have an assigned athletic trainer. Vendors are continuing to work tirelessly to hire the remaining positions. We are hopeful that we can have athletic trainers in place at all 25 high schools as soon as possible and appreciate the support and understanding of our MCPS Athletics community.

### **Transportation**

MCPS buses are available for teams to utilize throughout the season for off-site games or events, assuming there are available drivers and buses and based on the game time. It is important to note that, due to buses making runs afterschool for students, buses are not available during the hours of 1:35-4:35 p.m. from Monday-Friday. This constraint, along with the convenience of leaving later and coming home earlier, results in instances when parent or student drivers may be preferred. If parent or student drivers are being considered for transportation to off-site events, each student's parents/guardians have the option to opt out of allowing their student to drive with parent or student drivers. Parents are required to select which mode(s) of transportation they consent to allowing their student-athlete to utilize during the season. This information is used to assist in the decision-making process. Ultimately, the decision on the mode of transportation is made utilizing a collaborative process based on the availability of buses and the consent and preferences of parents/guardians for each team. Transportation to and from practices is the responsibility of each student-athlete and family. Please consult your coach or athletics specialist for additional information.

#### **Tickets & Season Passes**

Tickets for MCPS athletic events are sold through <u>GoFan</u>. The cost for admission is \$5, which includes convenience and processing fees. Schools are utilizing digital ticketing to the extent possible; however, some schools may offer a cash option.

Season passes are available at the local school and encouraged for all spectators planning on attending multiple events. Prices for the fall season are \$30 for adults and \$18 for students (convenience fee may be assessed if purchased electronically).

If student-athletes or parents/guardians require additional support regarding the cost of admission, they should consult with their athletics specialist (AD). We appreciate your support of MCPS Athletics!

## **Student-Athlete Leadership Council**

The Student-Athlete Leadership Council (SALC) will kickoff on Tuesday, September 13, 2022.
