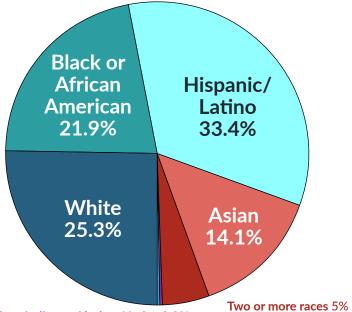

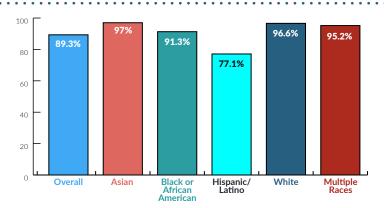


Student Demographics 2021-2022

Interim Superintendent's Recommended Fiscal Year Operating Budget

Overview

The Interim Superintendent's Recommended FY 2023 Operating Budget continues our focus on students, classrooms and schools. This budget continues to be centered on our core purpose of preparing all students to thrive in their future. Similar to one year ago, this budget has been developed at a time that the COVID-19 pandemic has been impacting our country, state and country, as well as teaching and learning in our school district.



Decreased Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Funding

As a result of the impact of the pandemic, the official Kindergarten through Grade 12 enrollment for MCPS as of September 30, 2021, was 2,347 eligible full-time equivalent (FTE) students fewer than were enrolled on the same date one year ago. Furthermore, it reflects a decrease of 5,995 students from two years ago. Based on the current MOE law, this would result in a decrease of \$32,350,978 in local contribution revenue from Montgomery County for FY 2023. The \$2.93 billion operating budget request includes \$131.3 million over MOE to sustain operations.

Other Budget Considerations

- Uncertainty remains how enrollment changes will ultimately impact revenue
- Exact aid of revenue from state and new *Blueprint for Maryland's Future* legislation revenue challenging to estimate
- Projected health care costs mandate additional investment
- Increase of 2,000 students projected for 2022-2023 school year

Important Investments

- ✓ Continues supports for mitigating learning disruption for students
- ✓ Continues mental/social emotional supports for students and employees
- ✓ Dedicates a full-time staff development teacher at every school
- ✓ Dedicates a full-time reading specialist teacher at every elementary school
- ✓ Establishes a Welcome Center for students/families new to our district
- ✓ Expands pre-Kindergarten classes for our youngest learners
