

## THANKS TO THE OUTSTANDING RECYCLING EFFORTS OF OUR STUDENTS AND STAFF,

Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) recycled 1,301 tons of paper and commingled materials during the second quarter (December–February) of the 2018–2019 school year. During this period, our MCPS elementary schools recycled an average of 5.62 pounds per person (PPP); middle schools achieved an average of 4.29 pounds per person, and high schools managed 2.74 PPP. To calculate pounds per person, we use this formula: total weight of recycled paper + total weight of commingled items ÷ total number of students + staff = PPP.

The SERT program is pleased to announce that the 25 schools listed below have earned recycling awards for the first quarter of this school year. Each of them recycled remarkably well, which resulted in PPP percentages that were well above the average for their level. We thank all of the students and staff for their outstanding recycling efforts throughout the quarter, and applicate the evidence of their commitment to conservation and sustainability.
