Humidifiers – Guidance Document





With regard to **humidifiers**, the Indoor Air Quality Office (IAQ) does not stock or provide these to schools for the following reasons. According to the EPA:

- Microorganisms often grow in humidifiers which are equipped with tanks containing standing water.
- · Humidifiers can disperse airborne microorganisms (e.g., bacterial and fungal organisms) from their water tanks.
- · Breathing mist containing these pollutants has been implicated in causing a condition known as Humidifier Fever.
- · Humidifiers should be cleaned every third day to prevent the buildup of scale, deposits or film that has formed on the device.
- Even manual cleaning of contaminated reservoirs can cause exposure to allergens and pathogens.

In general, portable humidifiers are designed for room-size usage in a residential setting and are not large enough to adequately humidify a classroom-size environment.
