## **DON'T LET IT HAPPEN!!**

Have you ever been asked to head a fundraising campaign for a cause you believed was worthy of as much effort as you could possibly devote? You committed yourself to countless hours of work... contacting corporate sponsors, completing grant applications, knitting, sewing, and producing craft items for sale at meetings and luncheons, and writing newsletter articles to inspire members of your association to donate to this most worthwhile cause. But, in the end, how disheartening and discouraging when your years of effort to raise the funds necessary to continue the project fall considerably short. That's when you must face the real possibility of discontinuing your work after years of success.



That's exactly where we find ourselves with our Toolkits Project.

We have received only 74 donations this year for a total of \$5,660. The cost of last summer's 2,100 kits exceeded \$27,300. We anticipate the number of kits needed for this coming summer will be greater, as will the cost of each kit. Am I being too optimistic to believe that we can raise an additional \$24,000 before June?

There's no question that our Toolkits Project is needed! According to recent reports, over 50,000 MCPS students who attend our schools come from families living below the poverty line. These families can barely provide the basic necessities of life for themselves and their children let alone the school supplies their kids need. For sixteen years, our project has helped these economically disadvantaged children!

Many MCPSRA members have worked hard for many years to make the Toolkits Project a local, state, and



national success story for our association and for the Title I kindergartners who desperately need help. It will be devastating to supporters and recipients if we have to abandon the Toolkits Project due to a lack of sufficient donations to keep it alive.

We are not asking each member for a lot. If each of you sponsored just one or two toolkits for \$10 each, we would have all the funds we needed to assure the success of the project this year. Furthermore, you could seek out additional donations from individuals and groups to which you belong, just as a member did last summer from the students, staff, and volunteers at the St. Matthew's and St. John's Presbyterian Churches Vacation Bible School in Silver Spring who sponsored nearly 350 kits with their donations.

## **Donations to MCPSRA**

Like most non-profit associations, MCPSRA welcomes and deeply appreciates donations that help support our many programs. However, we would like to clarify when and how such donations qualify as "Charitable Donations" per the IRS.

The IRS Tax code defines the types of organizations that can receive "tax deductible" donations from individuals. That tax status is given to organizations with a 501(c)(3) designation. These organizations, including religious, educational and charitable organizations, have other restrictions imposed. For example, they cannot lobby or be involved in other political action, cannot receive revenue from sales of "unrelated" items, etc. MCPSRA's mission, 'to protect our benefits, as provided by political entities both State and Local' is inconsistent with the requirements of section 501(c)(3) of the tax code. Similarly, running trips or other social functions would be impaired by this designation.

As indicated regularly in our "toolkits project" articles, and our support for the Josiah Henson Project you can still donate on a tax-deductible basis, **but ONLY through the MCPS Education Foundation** (which is a 501(c)(3)). Similarly, scholarship accounts can be set up through the Foundation and administered through MCPSRA. However, tax deductible donations need to be payable to the MCPS Education Foundation, NOT to MCPSRA. Of course, if you are not concerned about tax deductibility, donation checks to MCPSRA are always welcome.

## POLITICAL ACTION!

The Maryland Primary Election is Tuesday, April 28, 2020, and the MCPSRA Political Action Committee (MCPSRA-PAC) has already started working. Their goal is to identify the candidates for Montgomery County Board of Education and U.S. Congress (Districts 3, 6, and 8) who best support the interests of MCPSRA members.

MCPSRA-PAC volunteers are led by Committee Chair, Lou D'Ovidio. Together they will develop a set of questions to include in a candidate questionnaire, mail the questionnaire to the candidates, review candidate responses to the questionnaire, and conduct face to face interviews. The MCPSRA-PAC interviews all candidates who wish to be interviewed, and who could potentially earn our recommendation.

The Committee met in early November and will meet again in early February. Candidates selected for MCPSRA endorsement will be invited to our February 20 luncheon to meet and greet our members. Their names will appear in our April newsletter.
