Grading and Reporting for Students with Disabilities

Students working towards:

- **Grade Level Outcomes:** State Assessment Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC)
 - o Grades for students with disabilities will reflect progress toward the grade-level standards.
 - o Grades will no longer be adjusted for students functioning two or more grade levels below standard.
 - o Students in kindergarten through first grade earn Proficient in Progress (P,I.), and N's on the report card. Students in Grades 2 through 5 earn A, B, C, and D's.
 - Students with disabilities in Grades 2 through 5, functioning two or more grade levels below in reading, writing, and/mathematics, will receive a report card addendum identifying the instructional grade level at which the student is performing on each measurement topic as well as comments on student performance.
 - O Data for the report card addendum will be gathered from the small group instruction focusing on your students' area(s) of need.
 - o Students with disabilities will be instructed and assessed on grade-level standard using specially designed instructional strategies documented in their IEP.
- Alternate Learning Outcomes: State assessment Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA)
 - o Grades for students with significant cognitive disabilities pursing Alternate Learning Outcomes (ALO) will reflect progress toward the alternate standards.
 - Alternate learning standards are aligned to grade level standards through curriculum modifications and specially designed instructional strategies described in their IEP.
 - Students will receive a report card addendum that will identify the instructional grade level at which the student is performing on each measurement topic as well as comments on student performance.
