Safety Patrol Discipline Policy

BES safety patrollers are held to a high standard of behavior. Our policy is based on the patrol pledge, which students recite at every safety patrol meeting. It is as follows:



I promise to do my best to:

- Report for duty on time.
- Perform my duties faithfully.
- Strive to prevent traffic crashes, always setting a good example myself.
- Obey my teachers and officers of the patrol.
- Report any dangerous student practices.
- Strive to earn the respect of fellow students.

Safety patrollers serve as role models for the Bannockburn student community. Occasionally, a patroller will act in a way that is inconsistent with the pledge and their role as a school leader. To ensure a high standard of behavior among the safety patrol, we operate under a three-strike behavior modification program. We expect students to make mistakes; but, we also expect them to take their responsibilities seriously. Students who display errant behavior will receive a 'strike'. A parent notification form will be sent home and must be signed and returned before a student can return to their post. If a student gets to three strikes, sponsors will have a discussion with the patroller to determine the course of action. Dismissal may be the result if a sponsor feels that a student is not actively trying to improve or there is an attitude of disrespect that is permeating the group based on the student's behavior. We ask that parents be supportive of sponsors when a student receives a strike. The strike itself is often the only measure necessary to improve a student's behavior. It is also important that students understand that mistakes are made and that you learn from them. A list of possible safety patrol violations can be found on the BES website.
