#### ATTENTION GRADE 3 FAMILIES:

Information regarding the Center for Enriched Studies (formerly the Center for the Highly Gifted) was recently mailed directly to all parents of Grade 3 students in Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS). As stated in that letter, all Grade 3 students in your school will be centrally reviewed for potential candidacy for the CES rather than parents submitting an application. MCPS offers both regional and local programs. All Grade 3 students will be considered for a regional CES program, which is based on their address, unless they attend a school that houses a local program.

Schools that currently house a regional program include Lucy V. Barnsley, Chevy Chase, Clearspring, Cold Spring, Charles Drew, Fox Chapel, Mill Creek Towne, Oak View and Pine Crest elementary schools.

Schools that currently house a local program include: Rachel Carson, Piney Branch, Spark Matsunaga, and Stonegate elementary schools.

Students who demonstrate an overall above average academic profile will be considered for one of the seats in the CES. You will be notified in early February as to whether your child will be considered for the CES. Upon notification, you will have the option of requesting or declining CES testing. Testing will occur in February 2019, at your child's school, with selection results occurring in late March.

The meeting also will be live streamed on the MCPS homepage and will be posted on the MCPS website.

### **Attention ELL FAMILIES:**

ALL ELL (English Language Learner) students will take the WIDA Access for Ell's 2.0 test during the months of January and February to determine their English language proficiency level for next year. Students in grades 3-5 will take all domains of the test online; listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Grade 1-2 will write in testing booklets and take the rest of the test online. Kindergarteners will take the test individually with Ms. Pluznik or Mrs. Petrossian over the course of two days. Students will take only one test per day and no more than two in a week. Testing will occur in the E.S.O.L classrooms of Ms. Alison Pluznik. Mrs. Vivian Hu, and Mrs. Julie Petrossian. Testing will usually occur during your child's regularly scheduled E.S.O.L support time.
