LANGUAGE ARTS

Here we are at the start of Quarter 3! We will begin our time in Language Arts by discussing things that change. Our theme this quarter is Change and how it occurs in cycles. We will find evidence of change in Astronomy and use that information to create a feature article in our long-term project – the Astronomy Magazine. We will spend time studying the generalizations of change and we will read poetry by Emily Dickinson in order to extend that study. Students will create collages displaying the progression of time and cyclical patterns over the four seasons. They will be beautiful! We will continue to study ideas of change in class through our novels and short stories.

In writing, we have finished our Graphic Novels. All of our artists really showcased their talents! During the third quarter we will spend time reviewing text features for our magazine project, as well as analyzing feature articles. Math Info:

In quarter 3- students are extending the number line to include negative numbers. We will focus on developing an understanding of the meaning of negative numbers in real world contexts. Students will also explore the real number system. We will extend our knowledge of rational numbers through absolute value and interpreting the magnitude of numbers.

Science & Social Studies

During Science, students began learning about our upcoming project - CubeSats. As a group, we previewed information from NASA about what CubeSats are, how they work, and the different types of missions NASA is interested in exploring and researching. Students chose a partner to work with and together they have decided on a mission and explained the "why" behind their mission. Students will work with their partner to build and test their CubeSat, in addition to writing a proposal intended for NASA. This is an intense, hands-on project that we will be working on in school for the next few weeks!

In Social Studies, the students worked in choice groups to research one of the Amendments to the Constitution. They created presentations and shared them with the class. During the third quarter, we will jump ahead in time and learn about westward expansion and the different types of transportation settlers used to go west!
