CLOVERLY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR THE START OF SCHOOL, 2025-2026

School Hours

Our school hours are **9:00 a.m. - 3:25 p.m.** Students must not arrive at school before 8:40 a.m. There is no adult supervision available for students prior to 8:40 a.m. **For the safety and liability of your children, do not drop them off before 8:40 a.m.**

Attendance

Daily attendance is critical! Please do not send your child to school when they are sick, but please DO send your child to school every other day, on time.

Students who arrive in the school building after 9:00 a.m. are considered tardy and will be marked late. Students who arrive late must go directly to the main office, sign in, and receive a late pass. Each late arrival counts as a tardy.

In order to ensure continuity and to avoid disruptions during the instructional day, parents should avoid picking up students before 3:25 p.m. Parents should wait until 3:25 p.m. when students are dismissed. *If parents need to pick up their child(ren) before the end of the school day, please do so no later than 3:15 p.m.*

Daycare- Kids After Hours

Kids After Hours will continue to offer private before and after school daycare housed in the AP room. Morning daycare hours (before school) are 6:30 a.m. – 8:40 a.m. and evening daycare hours (after school) are 3:25 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. Please contact Kids After Hours by phone at 301-933-6888 if you are interested in daycare.

Bus Information

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Dismissal Procedures

Please review with your child how you intend for your child to be dismissed. Dismissal begins at 3:25 for all students. There are several options:

1. Bus Rider- If your student will be a bus rider, please review the bus schedule with your child. We assign colors to the bus routes to make it easier for the students. The color is listed on the linked schedule.
2. Car Riders- Students who are being picked up via car will go to the All Purpose Room. Please be patient in the carpool line as the number of car riders has increased.
3. Walkers- Your child will be considered a walker if they are walking home OR if you intend to greet them in the front of the building.
4. Kids After Hours (KAH)- Students attending KAH after school will dismiss directly to KAH.

Changes in Transportation or Location

It is important for the safety of students that we are notified if the mode of transportation or location changes when students leave each day. Therefore, students are **required** to bring a note indicating the change and endorsed with a parent signature and a phone number where he or she can be best contacted.

Student Item Drop-Off

It is important for students to be prepared with his or her materials each day. Parents who need to drop off their children's forgotten items should come to the main office and will then be directed to the student drop off table. The drop off table is located in the foyer area outside of the main office.

Lunch and Meal Prices

Students may bring a non-perishable, non-refrigerated lunch to school or may purchase breakfast and/or lunch at school. **Please note these meals are no longer free unless your family qualifies for free or reduced meals.** Breakfast will be available in the cafeteria between 8:40 and 9:00 a.m. and costs \$1.30. Meal Times and Recess Schedule

All meals take place in the All-Purpose Room. Thirty minutes is given for lunch and forty minutes is given for recess. There will be a separate, designated table, available at each lunch shift for students with food allergies. Please let the classroom teacher, health technician and school health nurse know if your child has food allergies and should be seated at the designated table. The final lunch/recess times will be shared the week before school begins.

Birthdays At School

In order to preserve instructional time and maintain safety for students with severe food allergies, **birthday treats are not permitted.** Students should also not distribute birthday party invitations at school.
