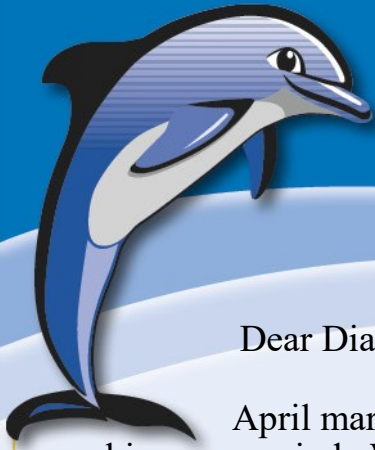

**Prekindergarten Program Enrollment for Diamond Elementary for 2026-2027 School Year:** Families who are interested in enrolling their child must reside in Montgomery County, as well as meet age-eligibility and income-eligibility qualifications. Students must turn 4 years old by September 1, 2026. Please consider reviewing details on the attached flyer and via the [MCPS Prekindergarten and Head Start webpage](#). Applications are currently being reviewed centrally for the 2026-2027 school year online via ParentVUE.

**Student Safety Reminders:** If your child walks to/from school, please review safety rules with them accordingly. Students should only cross a street at a stop sign, designated crossing area, traffic light, or where a crossing guard is posted. Car-riders driving through the Diamond community should adhere to speed limit postings and drive with caution.

**End of Day Plan Policy- Changes to Normal Dismissal Plans:** Students will be sent home using the daily routine communicated by the parent with the school. If a student's plans require a change from their normal dismissal, all changes must be made in writing by note or email to the school. Play dates should be prearranged in advance of the school day. If you forgot to send a note in the morning, or in the event of last minute changes to a student's dismissal plans, please call the main office prior to 3:00 p.m. Any adults who come to pick up a child will be asked to show documentation to verify identification and ensure student safety. Students cannot ride home on friend's school buses for playdates.

**Take Your Child to Work Day: Thursday, April 23, 2026 is *Take Your Child to Work Day*.** If you plan to take your child to work for all or part of that day, you must notify the school **no later than Wednesday, April 22, 2026**. If your child will not participate in *Take Your Child To Work Day*, disregard this message. You have the following options available to report this excused absence: If you plan to have your child participate in Take Your Child to Work Day, please click on the link to fill out the [Take Your Child To Work Day Form](#). If you prefer, you may complete the hard copy form and send it to your child's teacher. The **deadline** for submitting your request is **Wednesday, April 22, 2026**. We trust you and your child will have a wonderful, educational workday experience together.

**Student Toys Not Permitted at School:** We request that students do not bring personal toys, balls, cards (game cards, Pokemon cards, trading cards, etc), or electronics to school from home. Unfortunately, these items tend to cause disruption with other students or become lost or stolen items. The school provides all necessary recess equipment for student use. If students are bringing personal items for after school events such as a playdate or sleep-over, these items must remain in the student's back-pack and not be used or removed from the back-pack during the school day. The only exception would be if a teacher permits students to bring a personal item from home for show and tell purposes. Any items deemed to be disruptive to the learning environment will be confiscated by school personnel and parents will be notified.

**MCAP Assessment for Grades 3-5:** The state of Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) are aligned to the Common Core State Standards, which serve as the foundation for all MCPS Curriculum. The MCAP assessments are computer based and are divided into administered during the month of April/May. The students in grades 3-5 will complete four sessions in English/ Language Arts and four sessions in Mathematics. Student results of the MCAP assessment are mailed home to parents in August/September. For our school, the MCAP testing days are listed below.

Parents can assist in the following ways which include:

- Ensure your child is reading independently every night. Reading can vary from fiction and non-fiction texts.
- Ask your child comprehension questions to ensure they understand what they are reading.
- Review basic math facts: multiplication, division, addition and subtraction
- Make sure your child is in attendance each day for the state assessments (please see assessment chart below)
- Make sure your child has plenty of rest the night before and a healthy breakfast.
- Communicate to your child that they should do their best and “stick with it.”
- Please do not schedule doctor appointments or family events during the MCAP testing schedule for your child’s respective grade level.

**Diamond ES Parent Input on Student Profile Form for 2026-2027 School Year For Families Currently in Grades K-4:** With the end of the current school year quickly approaching, thoughts turn to planning for placement of students in classes for the next school year, 2026-2027. Your child's current teacher will advocate all she/he knows about your child's individual needs and capabilities for the placement decision, as we complete a thorough articulation process for each and every student. Parental input is also valued in the decision making process and the online form below can be used to provide the school with such information. In addition, this optional input form will be passed on to your child's new teacher in the fall. This optional input form should not be used to make a specific teacher request. (teacher requests will not be honored).

The process for composing classes for the upcoming year is a task that we take very seriously through careful and thoughtful consideration as we all want the best for all of the children at Diamond. It is important to ensure a productive classroom learning environment for your child as well as for all children at Diamond. The Diamond staff wants you to know that we are committed to providing classrooms in which each child will have the opportunity for learning and personal growth. When making class placements we consider the following variables as we aim towards creating a well-balanced, productive learning environment for all students:

- Relationships among individual children
- Compatibility between the individual child's learning styles/needs and the classroom environment.
- Heterogeneous placements of student's academic achievement levels
- A balance in terms of gender, ethnicity, and race
- The varying degrees of adult assistance needed by children for successful learning

If you are interested in providing this information to be considered as decisions are made for class placement for next year, please complete the electronic profile form as soon as possible and no later than April 17, 2026. If you provide this form to the school after April 17th, there is no guarantee this information will be used in the class placement process.

Please complete an individual form for each child in your family that will be attending Diamond ES for the 2026-2027 school year. It should be noted that this form is not to be used for specific teacher requests. Such requests will not be honored. Diamond Elementary values parental input and precludes specific teacher request in our process for class placement. This optional form is a way of offering opportunity for those of you who wish to provide parental input. We expect that parents will trust and respect the judgment of the Diamond staff in making placement decisions. We appreciate your support in our efforts to best serve the instructional needs of your child. Diamond Elementary staff members work together to draft initial groupings and class lists in May/June, but these are not finalized until late in the summer when we have the most up-to-date enrollment information. You and your child will be notified between August 17th-21st of the class placement decisions. The first day of school for the 2026-2027 school year is Tuesday, August 25, 2026.

## April Newsletter

What is going on in **ART** class during April?

**Kindergarten** will be making pinch pots.

**Grade 1** will be creating a multi-media floral still life.

**Grade 2** will be creating an Alaskan landscape featuring the Aurora Borealis.

**Grade 3** will be creating a floral collage.

**Grade 4** will be completing a sewn ice cream cone design.

**Grade 5** will be designing the 5th grade legacy mural.

What is going on in **MUSIC** class during April?

**Kindergarten** students will sing within a limited vocal range and sing songs that use the voice in a variety of ways. Students will use pictures and/or symbols to represent long/short and high/low sounds. Students will produce appropriate sounds in response to picture symbols representing long/short and high/low sounds. Students will maintain the steady beat on instruments using locomotor and non-locomotor movements. Students will create movement and sounds appropriate to accompany dramatic poetry and fables.

**1st grade** students will be working on reading and notating simple rhythm and pitch patterns. Students will write or place notes in spaces and on lines. Students will match pitch within a limited vocal range for simple melodies and songs. Students will arrange and create sounds to ostinato patterns. Students will dramatize simple stories or poems.

**2nd grade** students will be working on notating the pentatonic scale as well as half notes, half rests and dotted half notes. Students will continue singing within a limited range. Students will identify various musical symbols to facilitate notating the music they hear or compose. Students will create simple speech or melodic ostinato to accompany songs. Students will learn dances from various cultures.

**3rd grade** students will notate simple rhythm and/or pitch patterns. Students will use the voice to improvise phrases that answer given melodic phrases in the same style. Students will continue to read and identify traditional music notation and symbols. Students will learn dances from various cultures.

**4th grade** students will conduct music with meter in three and four. Students will compose and notate simple melodies using a given rhythm. Students will read a variety of melodies and rhythms. Students will learn dances from various cultures.

**5th grade** students will read and perform a simple melody on the treble staff in different keys using solfeggio or a comparable system. Students will compose and notate a short melody or rhythm using original pitches and rhythms. Students will learn dances from various cultures.

What is going on in **PHYSICAL EDUCATION** class during April?

**Kindergarten** students will be able to demonstrate an underhand strike with hand.

**1st grade** students will be able to demonstrate striking with various body parts.

**2nd grade** students will be able to demonstrate striking with short-handled implements.

**3rd grade** students will be able to demonstrate the forearm pass (bump).

**4th grade** students will be able to demonstrate the overhead pass (set).

**5th grade** students will be able to demonstrate the underhand serve.

What is going on in **COUNSELING** during April?

KG, 1st and 2nd grade students during Guidance lessons with Ms. Daina will begin **Learning From Each Other** unit which explores interpersonal problem solving involving a four-step process. Students will learn that solving problems is a natural and beneficial part of harmonious groups when they stop to cool off, talk about their problems, think about solutions, and try one. Students will learn about:

- perspective taking to understand the problem
- identifying problems and sharing thoughts and feelings constructively
- working together to constructively problem solve
- thinking about different solutions and using compromise
- taking responsibility and making amends

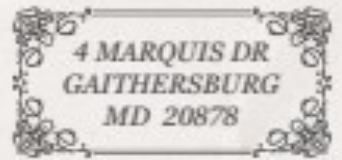
## How to register

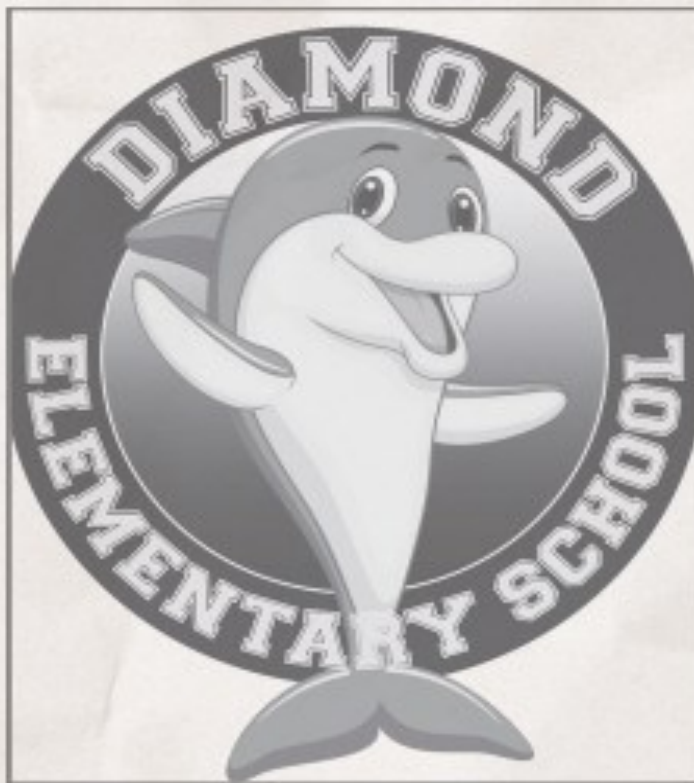
