SCHOOL LUNCH



School breakfast and lunch will be served beginning August 31 from 11:30 am to 1:00pm at Galway Elementary. Meals will be served Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday this year. To pick up curbside meals, the student's ID must be provided, if they don't have the ID, we will be taking names, grades, and home schools. Students can pick up a meal at any of the 74 open school food distribution sites in the county, it does not have to be their home school. Parents may pick up meals for more than one student, as long as the student is enrolled in MCPS and they can provide a student ID number. Also, they will not be taking any form of payment at the curb for safety reasons. Money may be added to their account using:

Meal Prices: The regular breakfast and lunch meal prices will be the same at all levels this year due to grab 'n go meal service. The reduced price lunch is 20 cents per meal at all levels. ● Breakfast: No Cost ● Lunch: Regular Price All Levels: \$2.55; Reduced Price All Levels: 20 cents

Families may apply for meal benefits by completing an **Application for Free and Reduced-Price Meals** for the current school year. **For faster processing, households may apply online at <u>MySchoolApps.com</u>. If students received meal benefits last year, a new application must be submitted this year. If an application is submitted online, please do not submit a paper application also.**

IMMUNIZATION COMPLIANCE



Maryland requires that all students receive required vaccinations in order to attend school. This requirement continues to be enforced for all Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) student to participate in virtual learning. Parents/Guardians must submit documentation of required immunizations by the first day of school attendance, even if attendance will be virtual. For students who start school virtually on Monday, August 31, 2020, the exclusion date is September 20, 2020,

which means that on Monday, September 21, 2020, students must be excluded from virtual instruction without documentation.

RECORDING LESSONS

<u>Teachers</u> will record lessons in order to support families and students, create flexibility in accessing learning experiences when attending live instruction is a barrier, and enhance the opportunity to review lesson content and resources.

- When students first log in, their video and audio is off by default. If students should not be recorded, they should leave these off.
- Recordings are protected, available only to students through a protected myMCPS site, unavailable for download, and will

delete after 72 hours.

• We recognize that even with these protections there may be students or families who do not want their children's images or voices to be captured. If you would like to have your student opt out of being in the recording, they should keep their video off in each class from the start of the school year. Parents/guardians are asked to indicate an opt out in the Parent Vue portal by September 11, 2020. Link to the Parent Vue Slide Deck provides families with information about activating the Parent Vue Account.

Parents will have the option to elect to withhold all or select directory information as in previous years.
