## **Additional School News**

PEP PILOT news: We are happy to announce that we will be accepting applications for our Preschool Education Program (PEP) for the 2019-2020 school year. PEP offers prekindergarten classes and services for children with disabilities ages 3–5. More specifically PEP PILOT provides a two-day per week early childhood setting for children with and without disabilities. If you choose to enroll your child, he/she will be in an inclusive class with other students with and without disabilities. Classes are Tuesday/Thursday or Wednesday/Friday for 2.5 hours per day. The cost is \$150 per semester or \$300 per year. The class is taught by an MCPS teacher certified in both General Education and Special Education. There is a para educator in the class to assist. The class follows the MCPS PreK Curriculum, "A Big Day for PreK." Priority is given to children that reside in the local school boundary. Your child must be 3 years old on or before the first day of school for PEP (please check the MCPS website for the official start date. It is usually a week after school starts for grades K-5). Due to the anticipated high numbers of applicants, enrollment will be based on a lottery system. Applications will be accepted during the month of February and assignments made in March. You will be contacted in early March if your child is awarded placement in the program. Although a wait list will be created with the names of applicants not originally placed, please have back up plans for Preschool, as there are a limited number of openings.

Applications will be available in the GES office starting February 4th. You can also email Gerry Reed, PEP Parent Educator, at <u>Gerry D\_Reed@mcpsmd.org</u> and request an application via email. Please return your application by February 28<sup>th</sup> to the main office at Germantown ES.

### **CENTER for Enriched Studies (CES):**

Friday, February 15<sup>th</sup> is the deadline for every Grade 3 parent to return the interest form to their child's teacher regarding testing for CES. The assessment at Germantown is 2/20/2019.

## **Volunteering with GES: Required Procedure for Volunteers**

On June 29, 2015, the Montgomery County Board of Education approved significant changes to the policy regarding Child Abuse and Neglect. The policy guides MCPS procedures and protocols for recognizing, reporting, and preventing suspected child abuse and neglect of students. If you wish to volunteer at Germantown Elementary School or any MCPS school this school year, MCPS is requiring all volunteers to complete an online course regarding Child Abuse and Neglect. This will take about a half hour to complete. Once completed you will receive a confirmation by email. Please print your confirmation and bring it to the office; they will keep this record on file.

If you completed your training in the 2018-2019 school year, you will need to renew your training in 2022. You do NOT need to do it again this year. If you have any questions, please call the office at 301-353-8050.

Parents and guardians who wish to request a Change of School Assignment (COSA) for their children from their home school may begin the process during the upcoming transfer season which begins on February 1. All COSA requests must be submitted no later than April 1.

Except for students in the Northeast Consortium (NEC), Downcounty Consortium (DCC), and Middle School Magnet Consortium (MSMC) areas, MCPS students are assigned to a school on the basis of their place of residence or their Individualized Education Program (IEP) and are expected to attend their home school.
