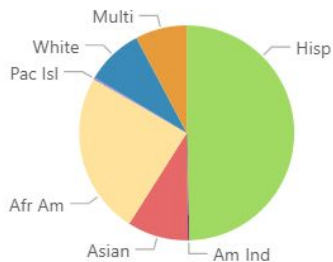

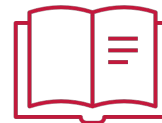

Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities

Priorities: Elevate academic performance in reading and math while expanding access to tutoring, mentoring, and afterschool learning opportunities.
Opportunities: Connect classroom learning to the real world through culturally responsive partnerships, field trips, and career exploration, while empowering and engaging families through collaborative academic workshops.

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice

Priorities: Expand the Steering Committee to include more family voice of various backgrounds and partners and other family leadership opportunities including affinity groups.
Opportunities: Cultivate shared leadership & collaboration by enhancing multilingual communication, creating spaces for collaborative planning, and growing leadership opportunities for our students, families, and partners.

Integrated Systems of Support

Priorities: Elevate student success by enhancing access to mental health resources, academic support, and holistic wraparound services.
Opportunities: Deepen community partnerships to build a network of essential services, including food security, parenting classes, behavioral health, and adult education.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care

Priorities: Continue to cultivate a inclusive, and culturally responsive school community where every student and family experiences a profound sense of belonging, respect, and support.
Opportunities: Foster a supportive school climate by scaling up cultural competence, culturally responsive teaching, trauma-informed care and social-emotional supports that deepen student connectedness, and continue to build strong, meaningful relationships with trusted adults.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement

Priorities: Cultivate trusting relationships and elevate authentic family engagement in school activities and student learning.
Opportunities: Remove barriers to participation by offering flexible engagement meeting times, family learning workshops, and volunteer pathways, backed by essential supports like childcare and translation.
