ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, students will be writing like a storyteller to create a narrative describing their life if they were an atom or molecule. We will be focusing on informational texts and close reading to understand what the text is about. Our language focus will be on different types of sentences, how to use conjunctions to combine or reduce sentences, and editing our work to eliminate run on sentences.

In SS, students will learn about how resources affected the economy in each colonial region. Students will also be researching different jobs during colonial times and how trade worked. We will discuss colonial resentment and why the colonists wanted to go to war with Britain.

STEM

In November and Marking Period 2, STEM students will begin learning about electromagnetic and wave properties. STEM students will also continue working as S.E.R.T (School and Recycling Team) members as they teach Glen Haven younger students about ways to conserve energy and water. During STEM class, students will also learn about the health topics, personal wellness, and problem solving/coping. In addition, students will continue improving their writing using the 5 stages of the writing process. Finally, STEM students will learn about growth and fixed mindsets and their impacts on learning.

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Math Standards

Fifth grade mathematicians will continue working on place value as we begin our next unit of study. In math, fifth graders are continuing to work on building their multiplication and division skills. We are currently working on division and transitioning into fractions. In order to best support students it would be helpful for students to practice basic facts at home. Even if it is just ten minutes a day. The students who have been practicing their fluency have been seeing gains during math class.
