ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, Students will continue to dig deeper into the new Benchmark Advance curriculum focused on literary close read complex texts. We are finishing a nonfiction unit where we are focusing on main idea and constructing an informative report. Next, we will be focusing on making predictions and inferences using fiction texts.

<u>STEM</u>

In STEM students will be learning about light waves. We will be doing investigations with mirrors and flashlights to see how waves reflect and retract.

Social Studies

In December students will continue to learn about the 13 colonies. They will be analyzing maps to determine how geographical location impacted the economics of a region. Students will evaluate the Plymouth and Jamestown communities to understand how colonists began to develop the United States. We will also be learning about the daily lives of the colonists and how life was different back then.

<u>ESOL</u>


ESOL stands for English for Speakers of Other Languages. In other words, ESOL students are people who already speak one or more languages and are learning English as an additional language.
