ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, students will be continuing to work on using the 5 steps of the writing process and the RACES strategy for standard W5.5 to improve our essay and EBT response writing. We will begin focusing on opinion and informative writing: writing like a lawyer and writing like a reporter. Our language focus will continue to be on similes and metaphors.

In SS, students will learn about colonial America. We will analyze texts from different viewpoints to determine how the British felt at the time and how colonists felt.

<u>STEM</u>

For October, STEM students will continue studying properties of matter and will be using what they learn to work on a NASA proposal in which they will develop a plan to determine a mystery substance from Mars. They will also be working with collaborative groups to research and build a hypothetical team of scientists that could help with this NASA proposal. STEM students will also be helping to maintain Glen Haven's "Green School" status by educating younger students and staff on ways to reduce energy, water, and paper use. Health topics will also be worked on as students learn about wellness and coping with problems.

Fifth grade mathematicians will start working on place value involving decimals. In math, fifth graders are working on building their multiplication and division skills in October. In order to best support students it would be helpful for students to practice basic facts at home. Even if it is just ten minutes a day.
