#### **ELA Standards**

In ELA, Students will be completing unit 4 of the Benchmark curriculum entitled "Recognizing Author's Point of View." Students are reading historical fiction texts in order to gain understanding of reading concepts. The writing task for this unit involves an opinion essay. Please continue reading at home every night for 20 minutes.

### **STEM**

In STEM students will be learning about light waves. We will be doing investigations with mirrors and flashlights to see how waves reflect and retract.

### Social Studies

In December students will continue to learn about the 13 colonies. They will be analyzing maps to determine how geographical location impacted the economics of a region. Students will evaluate the Plymouth and Jamestown communities to understand how colonists began to develop the United States. We will also be learning about the daily lives of the colonists and how life was different back then.

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## Math Standards

In math, fifth graders will be multiplying a whole number by a fraction and then moving on to multiplying a fraction by a fraction.
