ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, students will read literature texts. We will be reading historical and realistic fiction. Students will use quotations to provide evidence in text based responses. We will use our 5 steps of the writing process to ensure our work is quality and complete. We will be writing an opinion piece for a formal writing grade that persuades the reader In Social Studies, students will analyze the Articles of Confederation and continue to learn about how America was shaped into the country it is today.

<u>Stem</u>

STEM students will bring in the new year with the CubeSat Project. Students will design a CubeSat, along with payload, that will fulfill a request from NASA. Students will be able to apply their engineering and collaboration skills as they work with their team of "engineers" to complete this project.

STEM students will also continue working on their writing skills as they write opinion and informational essays We will continue using the RACES and 5 Stages of Writing Strategies to help us improve our structure, organization and use of conventions. Revising and Editing continue to be an area of improvement for most students. Students are encouraged to look for opportunities at home to practice if/when possible.

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<u>Math Standards</u>

Fifth grade mathematicians will continue working on fractions. Students will begin working on multiplying fractions by a whole number. After this students will learn to multiply a fraction by a fraction. In math, fifth graders are continuing to work on building their multiplication and division skills. In order to best support students it would be helpful for students to practice basic facts at home, as well as advanced multiplication and division (multi- digit).
