#### ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, Students will continue to dig deeper into the new Benchmark Advance curriculum focused on literary close read complex texts. We will delve into several excerpts from The Adventures of Tom Sawyer by Mark Twain, as well as generate and draft a Realistic Fiction Writing of our own.

#### <u>STEM</u>

In STEM students will be learning about waves. We will be evaluating how waves are transferred and how digitial information is transmitted in the environment. Students will also be looking at light waves and how energy is transferred.

### Social Studies

In November students will begin to learn about the 13 colonies. They will be analyzing maps to determine how geographical location impacted the economics of a region. Students will evaluate the Plymouth and Jamestown communities to understand how colonists began to develop the United States. We will also be learning about the daily lives of the colonists and how life was different back then.

In math, fifth graders are beginning the division unit. Students will be using the partial quotients and standard algorithm method to solve division word problems.
