ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, Students will continue to dig deeper into the new Benchmark Advance curriculum focused on Informational close read complex texts. We will explore knowledge of government and the US Constitution as well as developing constructed responses to a performance task.

<u>STEM</u>

For October, STEM students will continue studying properties of matter and will be using what they learn to work on a NASA proposal in which they will develop a plan to determine a mystery substance from Mars. They will also be working with collaborative groups to research and build a hypothetical team of scientists that could help with this NASA proposal.
