ELA/SS Standards

In ELA, students will be reviewing the routines and procedures for reading throughout the year. Students will independently read and respond to a book of their choosing in order to practice for the workstations throughout the year. Students will be writing various responses every day. These include persuasive writing and making connections to another text. During word work we will be reviewing spelling patterns such as open syllables, homophones, prefixes, and suffixes.

In Social Studies students will begin the year by looking at the 5 regions of pre-colonial America. We will study various Native American tribes and learn how trade sustained their economy.

STEM

For September, STEM students will be learning about matter through our physical science studies. They will be completing investigations using the Engineering Design Process. STEM students will engage in environmental science studies, as we learn about the Chesapeake Bay Watershed. Students will start brainstorming ways the Glen Haven community can reduce the amount of contaminants and pollutants in our water system. Finally, Grade 5 will begin to work on school wide SERT (School Energy and Recycling Team) initiatives as they begin to work on becoming leaders in reducing Glen Haven's energy, paper, and water usage amounts.
