Free and Reduced Meals Application Forms

Parents, Free and Reduced application forms need to be turned in as soon as possible if you wish to apply. The Division of Food and Nutrition Services have thousands of applications to process. Meal benefit eligibility from last year will remain current only through September 2012 or until a 2012-2013 application is processed. Students who received meal benefits last year must have a new application approved by the end of September in order to continue receiving free or reduced-price meals. Beginning October 1st, all students who do not have an approved application for the current year must pay for meals until a new application is processed.

Applications for the Elementary Centers for the *Highly Gifted (HGC)* were recently mailed directly to all parents of Grade 3 students in Montgomery County Public Schools (MSPS). This is a reminder that if you are interested in having your child considered for the HGC, you must complete the
