Of particular importance are the vellow Emergency Contact and Parent/Child Reunification forms that were sent home in our "second-day" packets. imperative that we have your emergency contact information available at all times and to document the names of the adults authorized to pick up your children in your absence.



Parents please remember that the bus lane is closed to cars from 8:20-9:00 each morning.

Only buses will be allowed in this area at this time. Also, remember to cross Dairymaid and Mateny at the intersections only. Crossing the street in areas other than marked intersections is dangerous and may also result in a "jay walking" citation from the police department. Thank you for your efforts to ensure the safety of all our Bullfrogs.

There are students in our school who have severe allergic reactions to various food products. Nuts, especially peanuts, are of particular concern. The allergic reactions can be life-threatening. Therefore, we have plans in place to ensure these students' safety



throughout the school year. We are asking for your help as we implement our "nut-free" classroom policy for classrooms where such allergies exist. This means that no nuts of any kind are permitted in the classroom during celebrations, snack-time, and on field trips. All food products brought in for birthday and holiday celebrations must be store-bought and contain the original ingredients' labels. **Nut products are permitted in the cafeteria**, as the lunchroom contains a "nut-free" table to allow the students with allergies to be seated away from lunches that may be harmful to them. Children without nut allergies may sit at the "nut-free" table upon request, ONLY if they are purchasing the school's lunch. (Please note that school-provided lunches do not contain nuts or nut oils). In our parent handbook (found on the website), we have listed a number of pizza shops that are peanut/tree nut free. Thank you for your support of the procedures that we have in place for students with severe food allergies. As always, the education, health, and safety of our students are paramount.

Through our PBIS initiative, we ensure that all students have a greater opportunity to be recognized for their positive behavior choices by receiving **Bullfrog Bucks** for their efforts. These "bucks" are matched with specific feedback,

explaining the positive behavior being demonstrated, and its relationship to our core values of being **Safe**, **Respectful**, **and Responsible**. Bullfrog Bucks are redeemable at our school store, which will be open to each class twice a month. **Any donations** are greatly appreciated so we can continue to keep our store stocked. Some school store donations could be: journals, pencils, bracelets, balls, bubbles, etc.

The **George B. Thomas Learning Academy (GBTLA)** is a tutoring and mentoring program that enhances the academic performance and achievement of students in grades 1-12. The program helps students reach their potential through individualized assistance with school work, study and test-taking skills. Certified teachers and volunteer tutors work with students on Saturday mornings from 8:30 - 11:30 a.m. Our cluster center is located at Northwest High School. National Hispanic Heritage Month



Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic

Heritage Month from September 15<sup>th</sup> through October 15th, by celebrating the histories. cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The day of September 15th is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In and Chile addition. Mexico celebrate their independence days on September 16th and September 18th, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Día de la Raza, which is October 12th, falls within this 30 day period.
