It is very important that teachers remain on schedule, so try to arrive early and respect the time limits set for each meeting. MEASURE children. To participate, please fill in the Application Envelope which will come home with your child and have your child return it to school. Applications are also available on line at www.identakid.com. It is recommended that each parent keep a card with them at all times and additional cards should be given to

anyone who regularly cares for your child. Participation in the program is at the individual Parents' option. **New this year**, and free if ordering multiple cards, we are introducing the electronic Ident-A-Kid card, known as **eKid-ID**. With your child's eKid-ID stored directly on your cell phone, you can immediately distribute his or her information to authorities, friends and neighbors in case of an emergency. The cost per child is \$7 for one card, \$10 for two cards, and \$13 for three cards (all include eKid-ID). School-based Flu Vaccination Clinic Dates: On Monday, November 5, 2012, DHHS will hold vaccination clinics to administer nasal spray flu vaccine (FluMist) for school-aged children only at:

John F. Kennedy High School Richard Montgomery High School Seneca Valley High School The clinics are scheduled from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.



On **Monday, November 12** DHHS will conduct flu vaccination clinics in all MCPS elementary schools. School Health Services Nurses and School Health Room Aides will administer nasal spray flu vaccine (FluMist).

Vaccinations will be given only to those children enrolled in the elementary schools where the clinic is held. Parents must sign up for appointments by contacting the school's health room. The two-hour clinics will begin 30 minutes after students are dismissed for the day. Please visit http://www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/emergency/flu/ for schedules and information.

Our clubs have gotten off to an amazing start! We appreciate everyone picking up their kids on time so that we would have a smooth dismissal.

Just a **few reminders about dismissal** in order to keep things running smoothly:

- Clubs are dismissed at 4:15.
- Students are either car riders or walkers.
- Walkers must be picked up by an adult or older sibling in middle or high school. Students cannot walk home alone. Parents can wait in the foyer area for the staff to dismiss the kids.
- When picking up your child by car, you must remain in the car. Once you are in the car circle, you must remain in your car and wait for your child to be dismissed. It is vital to a smooth dismissal that drivers continue to pull forward as students are picked up.
- If you enter Dairymaid Drive from Mateny Road, you must get in the car line that forms along the curb to enter the car circle. Cars should not be entering the car circle by crossing traffic on Dairymaid Drive.

There are students in our school who have **severe allergic reactions to various food products**. Nuts, especially peanuts, are of particular concern. **The allergic reactions can be life-threatening.** Therefore, we have plans in




place to ensure these students' safety throughout the school year. We are asking for your help as we implement our "nut-free" classroom policy for classrooms where such allergies exist. This means that no nuts of any kind are permitted in the classroom during celebrations, snack-time, and on field trips. All food products brought in for birthday and holiday celebrations must be store-bought and


contain the original ingredients' labels. **Nut products are permitted in the cafeteria**, as the lunchroom contains a "nut-free" table to allow the students with allergies to be seated away from lunches that may be harmful to them. Children without nut allergies may sit at the "nut-free" table upon request, ONLY if they are purchasing the school's lunch. (Please note that school-provided lunches do not contain nuts or nut oils). In our parent handbook (found on the website), we have listed a number of pizza shops that are peanut/tree nut free. Thank you for your support of the procedures that we have in place for students with severe food allergies. As always, the education, health, and safety of our students are paramount.

Outdoor Recess Policy

Temperatures are beginning to drop and it is getting colder with each passing week. Generally, students will go outside for recess when it is **32°F** or warmer. Anytime the temperature falls below 32°F, then we will stay inside. Please help us by making sure that your students are coming to school with appropriate winter clothing, coats, hats and gloves, as they will be going outside for recess on most days.

Please obey the "No Parking" signs in the bus lane, handicapped spaces and reserved spaces at the side parking lot. Parents are encouraged to drop their children off in the Kiss-N-Ride area
