Math Focus

Students will be finishing Module 4 with the focus on Area, then moving onto Module 5. Throughout the module, students have multiple experiences working with the Grade 3 specified fractional units of halves, thirds, fourths, sixths, and eighths. To build flexible thinking about fractions, students are exposed to additional fractional units such as fifths, ninths, and tenths.

Reading and Writing Focus

We will be in the middle of Unit 7 where students will study the concept of gravity and its effect on the Earth and other places in space. They will also learn about key people and events involved in the study and exploration of outer space. Students will explore the sun, the inner and outer planets, and the objects existing in our solar system. They will also study why planets stay in orbit.

Students will complete a multi-day informative writing project in which they will describe a day in the life of an astronaut on the International Space Station. Students will collaborate with their peers, share ideas, and provide feedback on one another's writing.

Science and Social Studies Focus

In Social Studies students will be starting Unit 3 in which they will explore economics, civics, geographic, and historical concepts. Students will develop an understanding of financial wellness, what it means to be civically engaged in society, issues central to economic development, and how cultures have evolved.

The revised Grade 3 Social Studies framework is designed to continue developing the social studies literacy and thinking skills of students beginning in elementary school and continuing into middle school. The framework is designed to reflect multiple perspectives and other anti-bias and antiracist (ABAR) content, promote social justice, and help students view themselves as global citizens. The design of the framework was influenced by the MSDE for Personal Financial Literacy Education Standards for Grades K-5.
