Learning Focus

Eureka Math

During the month of April, we will wrap up module 4 and our learning on decomposing and composing numbers within 10. We will begin working on module 5, focusing on numbers 10-20 and counting to 100. We will look closely at teen numbers and what each unit represents (tens and ones). After students work to master counting to 30, we will take it a step further and count to 100! Each student will build their own rekenrek to help them practice counting.

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Learning Focus Continued

Reading

CKLA Reading- For Skills we start Unit 8 and the students will learn fourteen new double-letter spellings for consonant sounds and four new high-frequency Tricky Words: funny, all, from, was. We will read a new decodable book "Sam" and rhyming words will be reviewed.

For Knowledge: We will start Unit 10- Colonial Towns & Townspeople. The Read-Alouds will acquaint students with what the daily life was like for the people who lived during those times, and how very different it was from student's own present-day experiences. This background knowledge will help set the stage for an in-depth understanding in later grades of specific historical events that also took place during colonial times.

Writing: Students will focus on written communication through drawing detailed pictures and writing short phrases or short sentences. Students will complete a Know-Wonder-Learn (KWL) chart. To help them organize and retell information.

Social Studies

This month we start with our Family unit in Health. Then we begin our history unit in social studies. This unit consists of collaborative discussions focusing on why the lives of people today are different from the lives of people long ago. We will compare toys, technology, and places of past and present. Students will have the opportunity to interview a trusted adult to gather information on the differences of past and present.
