Learning Focus

Eureka Math

In the beginning of April, we will wrap up module 4 and our learning on decomposing and composing numbers within 10. We will begin working on module 5. Module 5 focuses on numbers 10-20 and counting to 100. We will look closely at teen numbers and what each unit represents (tens and ones). Students have mastered counting to 30, now we will take it a step further and count to 100! Each student will build their own rekenrek to help them practice counting.

Reading

As we start unit 7, the big question we want to answer is, "Why do we celebrate people and events?" In this unit, we will read and compare different texts that highlight holidays and people all around the world. Students will review holidays they know and build their vocabulary as we read and study more. Students will have the opportunity to write a personal narrative about a holiday they have celebrated!



Social Studies

This month we are going to start our history unit in social studies.
