Learning Focus

Math: This month, we will continue to work within Module 1 of the Eureka curriculum. Kindergarteners will study numbers to 5 in different configurationations, math drawings and expressions. We will then continue to work with numbers to 5 through ordering and writing. Students will also begin to explore the meaning of 0. Toward the end of this month we will begin working with numbers 6-8 in various configurations.

Language Arts: Our reading curriculum will consist of Really Great Reading (RGR) for explicit phonics instruction whole group and small group. We will also use Benchmark Advance Language Comprehension instruction for reading and writing. During the next few weeks, we will begin exploring Unit 1 of the Benchmark Advance curriculum. Our essential question we will be discussing is "Why do we have rules?" In this unit, students read and compare selections about rules at school and at home to learn about responsibility. We will be also learning letters, letter sounds, sight words, print concepts, and written language. Through the shared writing process we will write key details, rules, narratives, opinions, and comparisons.

Social Studies: The first four weeks of instruction will be focused on describing roles, rights, and responsibilities of being a member of the family and school. We will also learn about leaders in our homes, communities, and country. We will talk about what rights and responsibilities various members of our community have.

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
