Learning Focus

Math: This month, we will continue to work within Module 1 of the Eureka curriculum. Kindergarteners will study numbers to 5 in different configurations, math drawings, and expressions. We will then continue to work with numbers to 5 through ordering and writing. Students will also begin to explore the meaning of 0. Toward the end of this month, we will begin working with numbers 6-8 in various configurations.



Language Arts: Our students have been doing a great job with our curriculum, CKLA! CKLA is split up into two sections- Skills and Knowledge. For the first half of the month in Skills, students will continue listening to environmental sounds and words within sentences, using the tripod grip to draw writing strokes, and using positional words. We will then move into Skills Unit 2 where our focus will shift to blending syllables and sounds using different motions. Breaking words into syllables and sounds is crucial to reading. In our Knowledge Domain, we are continuing to work with Nursery Rhymes. Within the Nursery Rhymes, students will understand and use vocabulary words in conversation, sequence the order of events, and draw the main characters.

Social Studies: The first four weeks of instruction will be focused on describing roles, rights, and responsibilities of being a member of the family and school. We will also learn about leaders in our homes, communities, and country. We will talk about what rights and responsibilities various members of our community have.
