Eureka Math

Students will tell addition “putting more” and subtraction “taking away” stories with up to 5 objects.

For example, during mealtime, you can say, “ You have 1 plate on the table. Here are 3 more plates on the table. How many plates are there altogether now?”

Number Formation Chants



0: Curve from the top, be a hero! Close the loop and make a zero!

1: Top to bottom then I am done. I just wrote the number one.

2: Half a moon there's more to do; slide to the right, I wrote a 2.

3: Backward C, backward C, that is how I write a 3.

4: Down the side, to the right some more. Top to bottom, I've written 4.

5: Down the side, around a hive. Give it a hat. I've written a 5.
