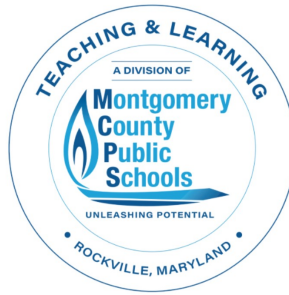


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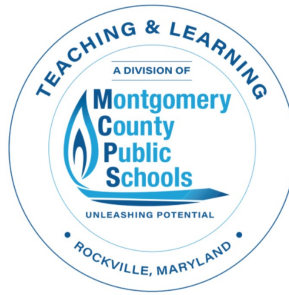

Social Studies United States History: 1300 - 1789 The Impact of European Exploration and Colonization (1450-1700 C.E.) Students will describe the impact of European exploration and colonization on existing indigenous African and American Indian cultures, including the cultural exchanges between European settlers and American Indian tribes and the rise of the Transatlantic Slave Trade. • Key Terms: culture, identity, motives and impact of colonization, cultural exchange, Wampanoag and Pequot Nations, enslavement, Metacom (King Philip), King Philip’s War, migration, causes and impact of the Transatlantic Slave Trade, Triangular Trade, Middle Passage, acts of resistance to slavery, bystander, and upstander	Science <i>Receiving and Processing Information</i> Fourth graders will explore how animals use their senses to survive, focusing on how eyes and ears work. Students will model how light allows us to see, compare human and animal eyes, and investigate how ear shapes help animals hear. The unit ends with students designing a device inspired by animal adaptations that helps people see and hear better in the dark. • Key terms: Light reflection, eye structure, internal and external structures, survival, growth, behavior, sensory input, information processing, brain response, criteria and constraints <i>**No core instructional textbook</i>
