#### Civics: U. S. Democracy & Civic Engagement

#### **Weather and Climate**

Students will investigate weather and climate. They will analyze seasonal weather patterns and be introduced to the difference between weather and climate and what the climate zones are around the United States and the world. Students explore four examples of extreme weather (blizzard, thunderstorm, tornado, and hurricane) and identify weather conditions for each and effects of the weather events on the environment.
