Dispositivos Móviles Personales

I. PROPÓSITO

Establecer procedimientos para la posesión y el uso de dispositivos móviles personales por parte de los estudiantes de las Escuelas Públicas del Condado de Montgomery (MCPS)

II. DEFINICIÓN

- A. Un dispositivo móvil personal (PMD, siglas en inglés), a los efectos del presente reglamento, tiene tres características distintivas:
 - 1. MCPS no es propietario ni emite el dispositivo.
 - 2. El dispositivo tiene la capacidad de obtener una conexión a Internet, WiFi o celular para enviar y recibir datos.
 - 3. El dispositivo tiene la capacidad de capturar sonido e imágenes/vídeos. Los ejemplos de PMD pueden incluir, entre otros, teléfonos móviles, lectores electrónicos, relojes inteligentes, tabletas, tecnología portátil, grabadoras de video y audio y dispositivos de juego que cumplan con los tres criterios.
- B. Director de escuela/persona designada se refiere al administrador(a) responsable de una escuela u oficina, según sea apropiado.
- C. La propiedad de MCPS se define como cualquier escuela u otra instalación de MCPS, incluidos los terrenos propiedad de MCPS u operados por ella; autobuses y otros vehículos propiedad de MCPS, operados o alquilados por ella; y las instalaciones y/o terrenos de cualquier actividad patrocinada por MCPS que involucre a estudiantes.

D. El día estudiantilcomienza a la hora en que llegan los estudiantes y finaliza a la hora de salida. El Día del Estudiante también incluye actividades co-curriculares y extracurriculares patrocinadas por MCPS y otros momentos de instrucción para estudiantes que asisten a programas de instrucción de día extendido y año extendido.

III. ANTECEDENTES

La Ley federal de Protección Infantil en Internet (CIPA, siglas en inglés) exige que las escuelas establezcan medidas de protección para limitar el acceso de los menores a contenido dañino en Internet. Los dispositivos móviles personales en la escuela, capaces de obtener de forma independiente una conexión a Internet, Wi-Fi o celular para enviar y recibir datos, evaden las medidas de protección de MCPS y están fuera de los esfuerzos de MCPS por limitar el acceso de los menores y la transmisión de contenido dañino a través de medios tecnológicos.

Además del uso para fines educativos legítimos de instrucción, el uso de contenido de Internet y redes sociales por parte de los estudiantes durante la jornada estudiantil puede interrumpir la instrucción y el aprendizaje de los estudiantes. Establecer el momento, el lugar y la manera en que los estudiantes pueden usar sus dispositivos personales es una estrategia para preservar la integridad del proceso de enseñanza y aprendizaje de MCPS al colocar restricciones razonables y apropiadas para la edad en el uso de dispositivos móviles personales por parte de los estudiantes en la propiedad de MCPS.

IV. ADMINISTRACIÓN DEL SISTEMA

- A. En cumplimiento con la ley federal, MCPS utiliza filtros y otras medidas tecnológicas para limitar la capacidad de los estudiantes de acceder a contenido dañino de Internet.
- B. Todos los equipos de MCPS, la red de MCPS y las cuentas de red de MCPS de los estudiantes son propiedad de MCPS y deben usarse solo con fines educativos y pueden supervisarse, registrarse y archivarse.
- C. MCPS supervisa y se reserva el derecho de investigar todos los PMD y la actividad de PMD en la red de MCPS.
- D. El uso de un PMD de una manera que cause interrupciones en la red o las operaciones de MCPS está prohibido tanto para los empleados como para los estudiantes. Los estudiantes y empleados pueden ser disciplinados por utilizar un PMD para alterar registros, destruir propiedad electrónica u otras infracciones disciplinarias relevantes.

V. RESPONSABILIDAD/OBLIGACIÓN

MCPS no asumirá ninguna responsabilidad por pérdida, robo o daño de un dispositivo o por el uso no autorizado de cualquier PMD.

VI. PROCEDIMIENTOS – DISPOSITIVOS MÓVILES PERSONALES DE LOS ESTUDIANTES EN LA PROPIEDAD DE MCPS

- A. Posesión de dispositivos móviles personales
 - 1. Los estudiantes pueden poseer los PMD en las instalaciones de MCPS y durante actividades patrocinadas por MCPS.
 - 2. Los estudiantes que utilicen un PMD para enviar o recibir datos en la propiedad de MCPS deben cumplir con los requisitos establecidos en la ley, las políticas del Consejo, las normas y reglamentos de MCPS (en adelante denominados "reglas de MCPS").
 - 3. Las autoridades escolares pueden confiscar los PMD si se utilizan de una manera incompatible con las reglas de MCPS, tal como se establece en el Reglamento JGB-RA de MCPS, Búsqueda e incautación.
- B. Uso autorizado de dispositivos móviles personales

Los estudiantes están sujetos a las siguientes reglas sobre el uso de PMD en la propiedad de MCPS. Los estudiantes son responsables de asegurarse de que sus PMD estén apagados y fuera de la vista cuando su uso no esté autorizado.

- 1. La discreción de los directores/designados para autorizar el uso de PMD es la siguiente:
 - a) Los directores pueden suspender temporalmente el uso de PMD en la propiedad de MCPS si se utilizan de una manera incompatible con las reglas de MCPS.
 - b) Los directores pueden autorizar el uso instructivo en colaboración con el equipo de liderazgo de la escuela.
 - c) El Departamento de Educación del Estado de Maryland (MSDE, siglas en inglés) prohíbe el uso de PMD por parte de estudiantes y personal en entornos de pruebas estandarizadas, donde podrían considerarse un riesgo para la seguridad de las pruebas.
 - i) El Reglamento ILA-RA de MCPS, Evaluaciones con requisitos de seguridad e informes, especifica ciertas exenciones que permiten a los estudiantes usar PMD durante las pruebas estandarizadas.

- ii) El director/designado debe buscar la aprobación de la División de Responsabilidad Compartida para el uso de PMD durante evaluaciones con requisitos de seguridad e informes.
- d) El director, en consulta con el personal de la escuela, puede aprobar el uso de un PMD para brindar una adaptación a un estudiante que no tiene un Programa Educativo Individualizado o un Plan 504, a menos que dichos usos estén restringidos en el Reglamento ILA-RA.
- e) Los directores deberán consultar con la División de Liderazgo y Mejora Escolar (DSLI, siglas en inglés) y la División de Servicios Tecnológicos (DTS, siglas en inglés) antes de autorizar el uso de dispositivos que se parezcan, pero que no cumplan con todos los criterios de un dispositivo móvil personal, como se define anteriormente. La DSLI y la DTS colaborarán para establecer una guía para innovaciones comerciales en dispositivos de comunicación apropiados para niños que pueden no cumplir con todos los criterios funcionales de los PMD según se define anteriormente.
- f) Los directores deberán coordinarse con la División de Comunicación para comunicar información pública creíble sobre incidentes emergentes de manera oportuna y completa, como se establece en el Reglamento KBA-RA, *Información Pública*.

Uso del autobús

Los estudiantes pueden usar PMD mientras viajan de ida y vuelta a la escuela o actividades patrocinadas por la escuela en los autobuses de MCPS u otros vehículos propiedad de, operados o alquilados por MCPS, siempre que dicho uso no afecte el funcionamiento seguro del autobús y cumpla con las reglas de MCPS.

3. Escuela elemental e intermedia

- a. Los estudiantes de la escuela elemental e intermedia pueden usar PMD antes y después de la jornada estudiantil.
- b. A los estudiantes de escuelas elementales e intermedias no se les permite usar PMD durante los períodos de instrucción, los períodos de almuerzo o entre clases/durante el tiempo de transición.

4. Escuelas secundarias

Los estudiantes de secundaria pueden usar su PMD antes y después de la jornada estudiantil, entre clases/tiempo de transición y durante los períodos de almuerzo de los estudiantes.

VII. DIRECTRICES DE USO RESPONSABLE

- A. Los estudiantes evitarán usar la tecnología de tal manera que interrumpa las actividades de otros estudiantes y empleados o viole las reglas de MCPS.
- B. Cualquier estudiante cuya conducta al usar un PMD viole las reglas de MCPS está sujeto a medidas disciplinarias, de acuerdo con el *Código de Conducta Estudiantil de MCPS*.
- C. La Política del Consejo JHF, Acoso escolar, hostigamiento o intimidación, prohíbe el acoso cibernético, incluida la mala conducta fuera de la propiedad de MCPS que puede estar sujeta a medidas disciplinarias cuando existe una conexión con el entorno escolar, independientemente de si el entorno educativo es en persona o virtual; la conducta crea un riesgo de daño a otros estudiantes mientras están en la escuela; o la conducta interfiere con el entorno educativo.
- D. Las pautas de uso responsable establecidas en el Reglamento IGT-RA de MCPS, Responsabilidades del usuario de los sistemas informáticos, la información electrónica y la seguridad de la red, se aplican a los estudiantes que utilizan un PMD en la propiedad de MCPS de la siguiente manera:
 - 1. Los estudiantes son responsables de asegurarse de utilizar sus PMD de manera segura en todo momento.
 - 2. No se podrá comunicar información mediante un PMD si viola la privacidad de otros, pone en peligro la salud o la seguridad de los estudiantes o empleados, es obscena o difamatoria, causa la interrupción de las actividades escolares o las operaciones de MCPS, perpetra deshonestidad académica o viola la seguridad de los sistemas informáticos de MCPS, la tecnología relacionada o la información electrónica.
 - a) La privacidad propia y de los demás incluye, pero no se limita a, mantener privada la información personal de los estudiantes y de otros (incluidas las calificaciones, el número de teléfono fijo o móvil, la dirección postal y las contraseñas de usuario).
 - b) La prohibición contra la deshonestidad académica incluye, pero no se limita a, el plagio, la alteración de los registros estudiantiles o la distribución de evaluaciones.
 - 3. Los estudiantes utilizarán la red de MCPS de manera productiva, apropiada y para fines relacionados con la escuela.

- 4. Los estudiantes no deberán cambiar ni eliminar información electrónica perteneciente a otros.
- 5. Los estudiantes reportarán inmediatamente el uso inapropiado de la tecnología.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS NOTIFICACIÓN ANUAL DE LA DISPONIBILIDAD DEL PLAN DE CONTROL DE ASBESTO Año Escolar 2025-2026

En 1987, la Agencia de Protección Ambiental (Environmental Protection Agency -EPA) publicó las normas definitivas para Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), 40 CFR Part 763. Estas normas exigen que las Agencias Educativas Locales (Local Education Agencies-LEAs) preparen Planes de Gestión de Asbesto para los edificios que tengan materiales que contengan asbesto (ACM). Un Plan de Gestión de Asbesto debe contener los siguientes elementos:

- Los resultados de encuestas y evaluaciones de ACM de la instalación, realizados por personal de inspección certificado.
- Un plan detallado para administrar ACM en el edificio y un plan cronológico para la eliminación, si es necesario.
- Un programa de actividades para las operaciones y mantenimiento para evitar disturbios accidentales de ACM durante los servicios rutinarios de mantenimiento y disminución requeridos.
- Un programa para vigilancia periódica de ACM y un plan de acción en caso de emergencia para responder a problemas no anticipados.
- Planes para una coordinación centralizada de todos los aspectos del programa de asbesto.

Esta notificación está siendo suministrada para cumplir con el requisito de notificación pública de AHERA. El plan de control de asbesto y el más reciente informe de inspección de su escuela está disponible en la oficina principal para revisión.

Es importante destacar que tanto EPA como Maryland State Department of the Environment (MDE) han indicado que la presencia de materiales ACM en las instalaciones no constituye, en sí, un peligro a la salud. Si el material no es dañado o perturbado, los trabajadores u otros ocupantes del edificio no corren peligro. MCPS Asbestos Management Program está diseñado para asegurar que cualquier material que contenga ACM permanezca en buenas condiciones hasta que sea retirado durante una renovación o proyecto de revitalizacion/expansion.
