How Can We Help You?

SEL Support: We are available to meet with students one on one to discuss emotional/behavior/friendship/academic concerns. We also work with EveryMind and are able to refer families out to additional support if needed. We provide professional development to staff around supporting students socially and emotionally. We are also the 504 coordinators for Rock View.

Lessons: 1-2 40 minute lessons will take place in each class every month. Lessons are built around our SEL focus area: problem-solving & conflict resolution. The purpose of our lessons are to be preventative, and help students become their best selves.

ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL - SAFETY FIRST!

- If you need to leave your vehicle during arrival and dismissal, and you are unable to find a
 parking space in the parking loop, please park on Denfeld Ave. or in the neighborhood
 (follow all posted signs).
- Remain alert for pedestrians at the bus and parking loop entrances and exits there are crosswalks at each entrance and exit.
- When dropping off your child in the car loop during arrival, please have your child exit from the passenger side of the car. Patrols/adults will assist you by opening and closing your car door.
- If you need to cross Denfeld Ave. on foot, please use the crosswalk located at the intersection of Connecticut Ave. and Denfeld Ave.
- Please support our student patrols and crossing guards. They are trained to assist with the safety of our students and other members of our community.
- When exiting at the bus loop exit, please follow the painted arrows there are two marked exit lanes, one for right turns and one for left turns. During our busy arrival and dismissal times, our school busses are on a tight schedule between their school routes. Please assist them by yielding to them in the bus loop when possible.

HEALTH & SAFETY

 MCPS strategy continues with optional masking, vaccination, strong hand hygiene throughout the day, enhanced sanitation and ventilation.

Updates to MCPS strategy

- no longer conducting weekly proactive testing
- no longer requiring quarantine of all students or staff identified as close contacts of individuals positive for COVID-19. Regardless of vaccination status, close contacts may continue in-person learning and will not have to quarantine as long as they remain asymptomatic

All persons who test positive for COVID-19 or have suspected COVID-19, regardless of vaccination status, should complete isolation as follows:

- Stay home for at least 5 full days from the date of symptom onset if symptomatic or from the date of the positive test if no symptoms. Day o is considered the day symptoms started in symptomatic persons or the day of the positive test (based on the date of testing) if asymptomatic.
- After day 5, if the person has no symptoms or if symptoms are improved they may return to school or child care if they wear a well-fitting mask for 5 additional days (day 6 through day 10).
- A negative test is not needed to return.

HEALTH & SAFETY CONT...

- Parents will be informed if there is a positive case of COVID in the class by email notification
- If there are 3 cases or more in a class in a short period of time, additional mitigation strategies may be implemented
- MCPS provides families with access to a set of pre-recorded videos of instruction in reading and math for students not able to attend school in person due to COVID safety protocols - OutClass through grade level Canvas courses. Information will be provided to parents about accessing OutClass when needed

KEEPING EVERYONE HEALTHY & SAFE!

- If you have any questions about whether or not you should send your child to school because of a health related concern, please reach out to our Health room staff. They are here to help make the best decision for your child and the health of others!
- If you suspect that your child has been exposed to COVID or might have COVID, please contact your child's doctor & our health room to discuss your next steps.
- If your child tests positive for COVID please contact the school immediately so we can begin our response process.




What is PTA?


