

Rolling Terrace Elementary's PBIS Behavior Expectation Plan



Level I Behaviors & Consequences

Level I behaviors are minor rule violations that will result in an immediate verbal correction with a possible consequence. **Level I behavior violations include:**

- Refusing to follow directions or complete classwork
- Disruptive behaviors including talking in class, making inappropriate noises and using inappropriate language
- Teasing
- Lying

Students who engage in Level I behaviors will be asked to identify inappropriate behavior and describe the appropriate replacement behavior. Students may receive a mild consequence delivered by the teacher or staff member designed to discourage the inappropriate behavior from occurring in the future. **Consequences for Level I behaviors may include but are not limited to:**

- Verbal correction
- Time out
- Apology to staff or fellow student
- Parent Contact for repeating behaviors

Level II Behaviors & Consequences

Level II behaviors are more serious in nature. Level II behaviors will result in an immediate verbal correction, a logical consequence, and a written minor form that is signed by and shared with the student's parent. **Level II behavior violations include:**

- Chronic Level I behaviors
- Arguing with the teacher or talking back
- Throwing objects without intent to harm others
- Cheating
- Harassment

Students who engage in Level II behaviors will be asked to identify inappropriate behavior and describe the appropriate replacement behavior. The incident will be documented using a Student Action Report which will be signed by the teacher and parent. **Consequences for Level II behaviors may include but are not limited to:**

- Verbal correction
- Loss of privileges
- Recess detention
- Time out
- Apology to staff or fellow student
- Reflection sheet

Level III Behaviors & Consequences

Level III behaviors will not be tolerated and will result in an office discipline referral. Level III behaviors may result in suspension but may also be corrected using a variety of logical consequences. **Level III behaviors may include:**

- Chronic Level II behavior
- Theft
- Vandalism/property damage
- Possession of weapons or look-alike weapons
- Intimidation/Verbal threats
- Harassment
- Verbal abuse/directed profanity
- Fighting

Students who engage in **Level III** behaviors will be referred to the office for immediate corrective action. After consulting with the parents and appropriate school personnel, the administration or administrative designee will issue appropriate consequences and facilitate corrective action designed to help the student improve his/her school behavior. **Consequences for Level III behaviors may include but are not limited to:**

Conference with student
Loss of privileges
Alternate setting

Time Out
Letter of apology to staff or fellow student
Suspension from school
