CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) for ALL Second Graders

On Tuesday, November 28, all second graders will take the Cognitive Ability Test (CogAT). Cognitive refers to a student's readiness to learn in different situations and environments and demonstrate creative problem-solving skills. The Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) shows us how well a child can reason abstractly and identify patterns and relationships in the world around them.CogAT is one of the data points considered for the Gifted and Talented screening process (other data points include DIBELS, MAP-R, MAP-M, Eureka & BM Assessments, Parent Survey, & Teacher Survey).
