Up Next:

Math: We started the school year with Module 1, where students have learned basic partners of ten and have used these partners as benchmarks to add and subtract up to 100. Students will also be working on Module 2, where they will use these strategies to add and subtract linear measurements.

Reading

Knowledge: Students will review the elements of fiction. They will take the lessons that are learned from the stories and use them to relate to the problems the characters face. Students will also be introduced to the American frontier as they listen to various tall tales and explore the elements of that genre.

Skills:

The skills unit is a great time for our class to work on different letter sounds and how we can recognize those sounds in text that we read. Below are some skills we have been working on:

- Read one- and two-syllable words with basic code spellings for short vowels, all consonants, spelling alternatives for /s/, /j/, /w/, /r/, /n/, and selected tricky spellings 'c', 'g', 's', 'n'
- Study Tricky Words he, she, we, be, me, the, was, of, a, do, down, how, to, what, where, why, from, once, one, two, could, would, should, there, said, says, word
- Read decodable stories
- Answer text-dependent questions about stories in complete sentences orally and in written form
- Write words, phrases, and sentences from dictation using phonics knowledge including phonemically plausible spellings

Writing: Students are working closely with teachers to reinforce fundamentals of writing like capitalization, punctuation, and spacing.

Social Studies: Students were challenged to reexamine the

roles of individuals and groups in a democratic society. We first explored the role of rules and laws in promoting orderliness, fairness, responsibility, privacy, and safety. Students worked together to determine social skills that are necessary for working in collaborative groups. They used these skills to work together to identify and analyze community concerns, ways to resolve these concerns, and the resulting compromises and conflicts that may occur. Students also identified and explored leadership positions and organizations that help to maintain safety and order in the community.

Harmony: We started the new year by introducing ourselves to the class and learning about our new classmates! We have shared All About Me Bags, and have started our morning meetings with Questions of the Day. We have been working on how to recognize and regulate our emotions using the Zones of Regulations.
