Ways to Prepare Your Child For Kindergarten

Practice Basic Kindergarten Skills

- Work on identifying the letters in your child's name
- Fine motor skills:
 - Hold a pencil correctly to write name using one uppercase letter and the rest lowercase letters
 - Practice using scissors and glue stick
- Count and identify numbers
- Practice following simple directions



I Take Care of Myself!



Teach Your Child to Take Care of Basic Needs

- Going to the bathroom independently
- Proper hand washing and blowing nose
- Putting on jacket/coat
- Fastening/Tying shoes
- Promoting independence and decision making
- Asking for help when needed
- Knowing lunch choice - lunch from home or buying lunch from school

Ease the Transition of Starting Kindergarten

- Develop routines at home with clear bedtime and morning routines
- Talk to your child about what kindergarten will be like to help them start preparing for this big transition
- Transition Day August 25th (1st day of school for Kinder)
- Back to School Night in September

Make Going to Kindergarten Special for your Child

- Let them pick out school supplies, like backpack and lunchbox
- Let them pick out what they want to wear on their first day of school
- Let them help you pack their backpack
- Make a special breakfast on the first day of school

- Built on the Science of Reading
- Sequences deep, rich, diverse content knowledge
- Everyday kindergarten students have a full lesson that builds on foundational skills and one that builds background knowledge



knowledge + foundational skills = skilled reading

Kindergarten Skills

Students can begin practicing writing their name.

Some skills: Letter names and sounds, rhyming words, blending, initial/medial/final sounds, long/short vowels, “tricky words”

Grammar: nouns, verbs, capitalization and punctuation

Writing: Opinion, narrative, informational


Dr. Martin Kozloff (2002) stated, "If a child memorized ten words, the child can only read ten words, but if a child learns the sounds of ten letters, the child will be able to read 350 three-sound words, 4,320 four-sound words, and 21,650 five-sound words."



Getting Ready: Backpack Tips



- When you know how your child will be traveling home from school (bus or car rider), **create a visible tag for their backpack.**
- Include an **emergency contact number.**
- Bus route information is published later in the summer.

Getting Ready: First Day of Kindergarten



- Pack a **change of clothes and underwear** that stays in the backpack at all times (seasonally appropriate).
- Pack a **water bottle**.
- Send in a **healthy snack**. Kids learn better with a full tummy!


