<p>Welcome families to our wonderful school. We have a great school year planned for your student. Our school is so excited to begin teaching our new reading curriculum. During the first month of school, we will be focusing on school rules, foundations and routines. We will focus on learning our reading and writing routines as well as how to navigate our literacy centers and small group reading.</p> <p>This is a time set aside for children to express their ideas through pictures and writing. We encourage the children to use the sounds they know to spell words the best they can. We don't focus on whether words are spelled "correctly" at this time. When your child is writing,, we ask that you support our efforts by helping your child to sound out words, but refraining from spelling the words out for them. At the beginning of Kindergarten, most students are nervous about writing and it takes time to nurture their willingness to take the risk to use this "inventive spelling." However, research has shown that children are far more expressive with their ideas when they don't feel limited to a few words that they know they can spell correctly. We thank you for your support!</p> <p>In math we will be working on the following skills. We will be using position words to describe the location of an object. We will work on counting as well as writing numbers. We will classify and sort objects in different ways and explain our thinking. In social studies we will be focusing on school rules and U.S. symbols. In Science students will be making observations about the weather. We can't wait for this exciting year to start!</p> 	<p>The first grade team enjoyed seeing so many of you at "Sneak Peek", and we are so excited for the year to begin. In an effort to maintain an open line of communication, we have a variety of ways to keep in touch. A great way to stay informed about what is happening in first grade is our website. You can find it at www.TravilahFirstGrade.com. Please let us know if there is any additional information you would like to see there. Next, your child received a blue take home folder on the first day of school, please check it nightly and return it to school with your child in the morning. Finally, we are available by email and phone when we are not with students or our own families.</p> <p>Our team works as a cohesive unit with many staff members in the building, and often the first graders will be learning as a whole grade level. We believe learning should be fun, engaging, and interactive, and work hard to provide a variety of learning opportunities, across various settings, for each student.</p> <p>In Math, we will focus on building mathematical foundations. We will spend most of the time analyzing numbers; breaking them apart, putting them back together, and determining what each digit means. We will also practice counting on and back from a given number. In Literacy, we will be implementing the new Benchmark Advance curriculum. For all of September we will be building a community of learners, which connects nicely with our Social Studies curriculum. We will identify roles and responsibilities in our community, work together to establish routines, and set expectations that will assist all of us in becoming excellent readers and writers! We will also sharpen our phonics skills, and learn about using accountable talk so we can have meaningful discussions about all types of writing. In Science, we are really excited to explore the phenomenon of the moon and sun in the sky. We will observe patterns and draw conclusions together!</p> <p>Finally, during our weekly class meetings we will be discussing virtues, what it means to be of good character in and out of the classroom, and what it looks like in the classroom. As the year progresses we will decide as a class upon which we would like to work, but our first focus will be Orderliness. We are excited for 1st grade to get off to a great start!</p>

<p>We are off to a wonderful start to the school year! Our second grade students are building a classroom of learners through discussing expectations, learning about each other through collaborative activities, and establishing classroom and school routines.</p> <p>This year, our second grade students will build literacy and language skills by participating in cross-disciplinary units of study in our new Benchmark Advance Program. Each three-week unit will focus on one topic. The topics will range from economics to earth science, and history and culture to themes in literature. As the students read poems, stories, plays, and informational articles, each second grader will strengthen</p>	<p>We are off to a great start in third grade! We will spend our first days as a class setting a strong foundation for learning by building classroom community, discussing goals and expectations for the year and getting to know one another.</p> <p>This year, our third grade students will build literacy and language skills by participating in ten cross-disciplinary units of study using the new reading and language arts program, Benchmark Advance. We are very excited to be working in this program with our students. In the first few weeks of school, students will become familiar with the routines for reading and writing during our literacy block. Our first unit of study will focus on "Government for the People".</p>

their reading and writing skills and strategies, participate in meaningful collaborative conversations, and make connections to their other content area studies. In our first unit of study, "Government at Work," we will be learning about the role that government plays in our lives. For example, police officers and firefighters help keep us safe, and local workers help keep parks beautiful and clean. We will also be learning about laws—what they are, why they matter, and what happens when we break them.

In math, our second grade students will be establishing daily math routines through modeling, engaging instruction, and independent work to show understanding of concepts. Second graders will learn about counting within 1,000 by 10's and 100's, understanding place value by identifying hundreds, tens, and ones of a given number, and mental strategies of adding numbers with sums up to 20.

In social studies, our learning will be focused on the relationships among rights, responsibilities, and democratic ideas. In science, our learning will be focused on describing and classifying different kinds of materials by their observable properties.

We are looking forward to working with each student and family for a successful second grade year!

In math, students will be reviewing place value before we round numbers to the nearest 100 and the nearest 10. We will also be adding and subtracting three digit numbers and problem solving. In social studies, students are examining traits of being a good citizen, working for the common good and civics. In science, students will investigate the phenomena of forces. We will also focus on balanced and unbalanced forces and make predictions about patterns of motion. Students will then learn about magnetic forces. In quarter one, in integrated reading and health, we will focus on work habits and study skills. Students will be keeping binders in third grade as an organizational tool. All papers will be filed by subject and an assignment book will be kept in the binder. Students should bring their binders to school each day and they will be coming home each day. Please check the binder with your child each evening. This is a great organizational and communication tool. We are excited to begin a new year of learning!



FOURTH GRADE TEAM

The fourth graders are off to a great start! We are spending the first few days building a strong classroom community and fostering positive relationships that will be important throughout this upcoming school year.

We are excited to implement our new reading curriculum, Benchmark Advance! The first 15 days of the curriculum are spent establishing and reviewing important classroom procedures and routines for our reading block. Math classes will begin their exploration of place value. Students will be reviewing and learning how to read, write, round, and compare numbers up to 6-digits. We are also strengthening our students' foundational skills with quick daily math practice. Please remind your child to practice their math facts as it is a critical skill for later fourth grade concepts. In social studies, we will start by identifying the human-made and natural-made features in Maryland. Understanding our geographic location and geographic features helps students identify the resources available to survive in our area. In science, students will focus on energy and understanding how energy can be transferred.

In fourth grade, we strongly encourage the use of the assignment book in order to help students develop the important skills of organization and time management. This is a great tool that we will use at school for students to record nightly homework and any other reminders for themselves (i.e. bring instrument or wear sneakers for PE). Your role in this learning experience is to initial in the space indicated in the assignment book showing your support of their homework. We consider this task your student's responsibility, so they should come to you for your initials. We are confident this will be a fun and successful year for all!

FIFTH GRADE TEAM

Fifth-grade students are amazing and eager to continue deepening and broadening their knowledge. We are so happy to have the opportunity to get to know your children, watch them grow, and instruct them.

This year MCPS is using a new reading/language arts program, Benchmark Advance. The program is tailored to meet the demands of today's Standards. Students will engage with more rigorous and complex texts as they examine and analyze in-depth to interpret various texts. The first fifteen days of reading instruction focuses on routines and reviews implementing teacher-led modeling. At the start of each unit, students will bring home a family letter describing the unit of study. Our first unit of study is *The U.S. Constitution: Then and Now.*"

The instructional focus for Social Studies begins with students investigating how different perspectives can lead to conflict and compromise. Our unit of study ends with analyzing and exploring the roles and viewpoints of individuals and groups during and after the American Revolutionary War.

Marking Period 1 Health curriculum focuses on students practicing collaboration skills as they demonstrate healthy ways to communicate needs, wants, emotions, opinions, and information. We will also work on time management strategies to effectively reduce stress in a variety of situations.

Science is hands on and engaging as we identify the structure and properties of matter as well as chemical reactions.

Math 5 mathematical standards include using standard algorithm to multiply multi-digit whole numbers, writing and interpreting numerical expressions, and identifying and determining volume.

Compacted Math focuses on multiplication with fractions, division of whole numbers by fractions, and division of fractions by whole numbers.

Fifth grade has a rich and rewarding curriculum. We appreciate your

support this year as we look forward to an engaging and fabulous year!
