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School Hours

The first day of school is Tuesday, September 3, 2019. **Our school day begins at 9:15 am and ends at 3:50 pm** Students may not arrive at school earlier than 9:05 am The best way to have smooth arrival and dismissal times the first week of school is to start your child's regular routine on the first day of school. This way all children will be included in our first day of routines and practices. Staff members will be in the halls to guide students to their destination. To prevent disruptions in the instructional day, parents are not permitted to walk students to their classrooms in the morning.

Arrival

The Travilah instructional day officially begins at 9:25 am immediately after the morning announcements. Please make sure to wait with your child if you arrive prior to 9:05 am Staff will not be on duty until that time, and we do not want children to be unsupervised. All students entering after 9:25 am. will need to be signed in at the office by a parent or guardian. Car riders will line up in front of the main doors. Bus riders will line up on the black top in front of the school and enter through the side door at 9:15 am, and go directly to their classroom. Please note this is a change from years past where all students previously lined up in front of the main doors. Once students enter the building, they will wait quietly in the hallway outside of their classrooms until the teacher arrives. During inclement weather, children will line up in the hallways, outside their classrooms.

Dismissal

Students will dismiss from their classrooms beginning at 3:50 pm Bus riders will be dismissed from their classrooms as buses arrive, leaving through the exit near the main office. Teachers should be notified in writing of any changes to a student's arrival or dismissal routine. If a change in dismissal during the school day, please notify/call the main office by 3:00 pm to ensure the proper dismissal of your student.

Early dismissal days- All students will be dismissed at 1:20 pm after lunch.

Attendance

Parents must call the school attendance line at 240-740-4290 in the morning if his/her child is absent. The attendance line is on 24 hours a day so parents can leave messages about absent students. Please leave your child's name, his/her teacher's name, and the reason for the absence. Please send a note with your child when he/she returns with the reason for the absence. Reminder: Please keep your child home if he/she is sick. Children must be "fever free" for 24 hours before returning to school.

Bus Transportation

Please click <u>here</u> to view the bus transportation letter from our bus depot manager. If your child normally rides a bus, please allow him/her to ride it to and from school on the first day. Click <u>here</u> for the AM bus arrival schedule and <u>here</u> for the PM bus departure schedule. A bus schedule is provided on our website.

Since transportation of students is a very complex operation, for the first few weeks of school, I encourage you to wait with your child for the bus to arrive, to be at the designated stop when the bus returns, and to allow ample waiting time until the schedule has been refined. Should you have any questions, please call Ms. Deborah Lewis, Transportation Supervisor at 301-670-8273. Children may not ride any other bus except the one they have been assigned. If your child is planning to get off at a stop that is different from his/her regular stop, a note must be given to the bus driver. Children may not ride a different bus because of a "play date." Only those children who have a note explaining a change in after school day care will be permitted to change buses.

Bus Safety Rules are very important. Please make sure to review the rules of the bus with your child prior to the start of school. Ride by the Rules is specifically designed to:

- Raise awareness of students and parents about the importance of appropriate behavior on school buses
- Communicate guidelines for safe and respectful behavior
- Communicate guidelines for reporting disciplinary problems

Car Riders

Parents who drive their children to school can begin dropping them off starting at 9:05 am No adult supervision will be present prior to 9:05 am. Travilah Road is the only entrance for cars at all times. It is essential that children be safe in the front lot, so please drop your child off on the sidewalk next to the car circle. Children should not be discharged in the parking lot or on the street. We do not want children to walk among moving vehicles. We will have staff unloading the cars, so please have your child ready to exit the car quickly from the passenger side. After your child is dropped off safely onto the curb, please pull out so that other cars can move up and we can unload children as quickly as possible. **DuFief Mill Road is the only exit for cars.** There are two lanes from which to exit. Travilah staff and patrols will assist with helping students out of vehicles. Please click here to view the transportation map.

Parent Portal is the primary home-to-school communication vehicle for schools to share information regarding grades, attendance, scheduling, and more. All parents and students will have access to academic information and attendance via the new myMCPS Parent and Student Portal including the myMCPS Mobile App. Additional setup and support can be found here. We will also have devices on hand during our Open House to help parents sign up. We ask that you sign up as report cards and interims will no longer be printed after Quarter 1 for the 2019-2020 school year. *New MCPS Parents/guardians and parents/guardians who did not create a parent account last year who reside at the primary address of an MCPS student(s) grades K-12 will receive a myMCPS Parent Portal activation letter in the mail. Families of students who enroll in MCPS after this initial mailing will receive an activation letter within 1 week of the student's enrollment date.

AlertMCPS

Alert MCPS is a way that you can receive text messages or email from Montgomery County Public Schools during weather-related emergencies and other major events that impact school system operations. Alert MCPS is administered by Montgomery County Public Schools and is part of the Montgomery County Alert System. You can choose Alerts in English, Spanish, or for specific schools. Sign up here.

Email addresses are not visible to anyone except the principal as the sender and only emails related to Travilah and MCPS will be sent. If you are not receiving emails from our school, please contact the office.

Birthdays falling on a weekend or holiday date will be announced the last day before or immediately after the weekend or holiday. Summer birthdays will be announced over a period of days at the end of the school year. Birthdays are NOT celebrated with food items brought into the classrooms or cafeteria during lunch time. School Visitors & Volunteers

To ensure the safety of all children and staff, it is imperative that all visitors (including parents, guardians, and caregivers) report to the office to identify themselves and their purpose for visiting before going further into the building. All visitors must have their driver's license available to scan into our Visitor Management System (VMS). Once visitors are checked in, they will receive a badge/sticker to wear. Visitors not wearing proper identification will be stopped and questioned as to their business in the school building and will be redirected to the

Cell Phones

Students may bring a cell phone to school for use after school hours. Phones must be turned off and kept in backpacks. They may not be used during the day.

Curriculum Update

Our academic program will focus on providing students with differentiated instruction that is aligned with the Common Core State Standards. We will implement a new curriculum for the 2019-2020 school year. Students in K-5 will participate in the Benchmark Advance Curriculum for Literacy. All of our teachers attended training in the spring and summer on these materials. K-5 students will continue to use the Next Generation Science Standards for Science and Curriculum 2.0 for Social Studies. Students in 4th and 5th grade who were identified to participate in Compacted Math will use the Curriculum 2.0 Compacted Math curriculum. Next year, we will implement the Eureka Math Curriculum for Mathematics. Families will learn more about our curriculum program at Back to School Night, and at an upcoming PTA meeting. MCPS will also be hosting Curriculum Information Nights in the fall. In addition, our school staff will provide families with curriculum information and resources throughout the year.

Travilah Expectations & Student Support

At Travilah, we expect each child to be responsible for his/her own behavior. Our Travilah Expectations are as follows:

Emergency Preparedness

Over the course of the school year, students will participate in safety drills. In addition to five fire drills, students will experience the following drills as part of the MCPS Emergency Preparedness plan: Lockdown, Shelter, Severe Weather, Drop, Cover and Hold, Evacuation, and Reverse Evacuation.
