



Educational Information For the Fall

MCPS Email Response to Governor Hogan's 8/27/20 Announcement

We thank Governor Larry Hogan and State Superintendent Karen Salmon for their guidance on the return to in-person instruction for local school districts. However, we are deeply disappointed by the last-minute announcement of this critical information for school systems. MCPS will begin the school year in a virtual-only instructional model on August 31, as scheduled. We know many in our community will have questions about what this new guidance means for our students. Please allow us time to thoughtfully assess these important developments and continue to prepare for a successful start to the school year.

As we shared earlier this month, we are working with county health officials on a process that will allow us to bring in small groups of students, such as students in specific special education programs. The Board of Education will meet in the coming weeks to continue to discuss a plan for the 2020-2021 school year. Our focus remains on the academic needs and health and safety of our students and staff.

Our Guiding Principles

The guiding principles below are highlighted in the school system's recovery plan titled, "Reimagine, Reopen, Recover" which can be accessed on the MCPS website.

- Ensure the safety and wellness of students
- Provide a robust and dynamic virtual learning experience for the first semester
- Equity: Ensuring all means all
- Optimize use of resources
- Community and stakeholder engagement in plan development

Grading and Reporting

- To foster a robust instructional program, students will engage in live and high-quality learning experiences.
- MCPS is returning to a letter grade system for quarter and semester grades.
- Teachers will be administering classroom, external, and district assessments to students.
- Expectations for grading categories, assignment weights, common assessments, due dates/deadlines, etc. will be returning to expectations prior to March 2020.
- Students <u>may</u> be expected to complete asynchronous learning experiences and independent work between class meetings. Students may expect to spend up to 30-45 minutes per day of independent work.
- Parents should expect students to receive 1 graded assignment per week in courses.
- Electives may function differently from core academic classes.

B-CC Weekly Schedule

- All high schools in MCPS must follow the same schedule.
- Schools will follow an 8
 period schedule. Period 8
 is Baron Time.
- Classes will meet for live instruction for 60 minutes twice a week.
- The schedule will include times for TAP, HS+, advisory and teacher planning.

What is Baron Time?

Flexible time built in the schedule and will be used for a variety of purposes including

- Academic Support
- Link Crew activities
- IB Middle Years Programme work
- Club meetings
- Social Emotional Learning Lessons
- Community Building
- Other identified needs as necessary

What is the structure of a typical zoom lesson?

Time - Total 60 mins.	Content	Experience	
5 mins.	Welcome/Warm-up	Teachers will take time to be explicit about the mechanics of the lesson, as well as norms, such as muting and using the chat.	
5 mins.	Framing the lesson	Review of the language and thinking skill objectives.	
20/25 mins.	Direct Instruction	Whole class discussion/processing, content delivery and questions.	
20 mins.	Student Breakout Off Screen Time	Students practice concepts and discuss.Virtual collaboration. Independent work time.	
5/10 mins. Closure		Bring closure to the lesson content. Assess what has been learned.	

Student Engagement Is <u>Critical</u> and <u>Important</u>

- It is essential that students are engaged in learning on a regular and ongoing basis. If a child does not fully engage in virtual learning, it is all but assured s/he will not learn.
- Daily attendance will be taken in ALL classes throughout the first semester.

The Big Idea	We all recognize that distance learning in the spring was not ideal and was a response to the global health emergency. We will move forward with a growth mindset, characterized by high expectations for teaching and learning.

Teachers will	 Set high expectations and clearly communicate them to students Create a welcoming, inclusive, and safe learning community Build positive relationships with students Develop culturally responsive classrooms, including culturally relevant lessons Develop learning opportunities that require student participation and interaction Differentiate lessons and activities Assess students according to grading and reporting expectations including providing timely and effective feedback Maintain flexibility given challenges faced by all during this pandemic Utilize the cycle of communication (student, parent, counselor, administrator) when students are not engaged 			

Special Education Services/504 Plans

- Students will continue to have their services documented in an Individual Distance Learning Plan (IDLP). The IDLP will align with each student's IEP and describe the delivery of special education services in the distance format.
- Student should expect to receive -
 - Core instruction according to the standards of the curriculum,
 - Support with learning from Special Education teachers and paraeducators in a number of ways.
 - Intervention support both in small group and one-on-one settings.
 - Related services like speech, physical and occupational therapies, etc.
- 504 Plans -
 - Students will have a written IDLP. This information will be shared with teachers to support accommodations in the classroom.
 - Counselors will continue to hold screening and Annual Reviews for 504 plans virtually until we return to school.

Technology Information

- All students need a device to support online/virtual learning throughout the first semester. Students will need this device to access learning on MyMCPS Classroom.
- If you have been assigned an MCPS chromebook or MiFi device, continue using this device.
- A school technology distribution took place at BCC from 8/25-8/28.
- Students in <u>grade 9</u> are eligible to receive a new Lenovo device and are encouraged to swap out their current device. Students and families will be assigned an obligation when a chromebook is given out.
- Technology that is not picked up prior to the start of school will remain at BCC for pick-up at a later date.
- MiFi devices are in limited supply, for this reason they will not be given out at school buildings. They are being given out at 45 W Gude Drive in Rockville.

Materials Information

- During the week of August 24th, B-CC distributed instructional materials to students to use during the first semester. Families were invited to come to the school to pick-up textbooks, materials and technology.
- What if you were not able to come? Additional pick-up dates will be announced early in the start of the school year.
- Important information:
 - Grade 9: students <u>did not</u> receive any textbooks. Materials will be electronic.
 - Grades 10-12: students may or may not have instructional materials based on the course. A database was developed to identify which courses were using a textbook which you can find in Dr. Mooney's community message.
- It is recognized that not ALL students will have all these materials when schools open. Don't worry...we have time...we will get there.

Extra Curricular Activities and Athletics
