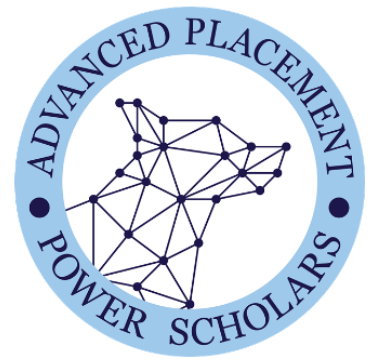

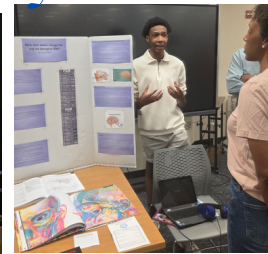
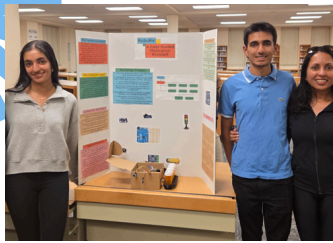

APPS Students at Youth and Government (YAG)

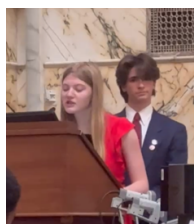

Student Spotlight



Chase Bentley was selected to intern for Clive Stafford Smith and his organization, The Justice League. Stafford Smith is an international human rights lawyer and has defended numerous inmates faced with a death sentence, as well as been instrumental in exposing Guantanamo Bay for its human rights abuses and getting inmates released. Only a few high school students are in the group of roughly 75 interns. They will be working on various cases, including postmortem exoneration cases in the US, which will not only bring justice for the wrongfully executed, but also reopen investigations into the real perpetrators. Chase will be in Bristol England for the summer while they intern with this organization.
