SUBJECT: Food and Nutrition Services Program Updates for School Year 2026

Bottom Line Up Front

This memo provides updates for the 2025–2026 school year from the Department of Food and Nutrition Services (DFNS) about menus and special dietary needs, meal service accountability, and quidelines for CEP and Non-CEP Schools.

Menus and Special Dietary Needs

Menus, including nutrition and allergen information, can be viewed on the <u>DFNS website</u> through <u>MealViewer</u>. <u>MCPS Form 240-23, Special Dietary Needs Form</u>, may be used to request meal accommodations for students eating school meals.

Student Meal Identification

All students will use their Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) student identification number for meal accountability. All points of service (POS) in the cafeteria will have barcode scanners and PIN pads. DFNS will provide barcoded cards for elementary school students for use at the POS. Schools will receive cards for newly enrolled students only. Damaged or lost cards should be replaced during the year through a request to the cafeteria manager.

Meal Service Accountability Training

Breakfast and lunch meals provided in the classroom require school staff to be trained and to take meal service accountability. Afterschool snack and supper meals may require school staff to be trained, and to take meal service accountability. DFNS will provide training for applicable staff.

Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Schools	MCPS will continue to provide free breakfast and lunch at <u>60 schools</u> through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP).
Non-Community Eligibility Provision (Non-CEP) Schools	DFNS utilizes a multi-layered approach to ensure every student who may qualify for Free and Reduced-price Meals (FARMS) is determined as eligible annually. Our goal is to capture all eligible students using direct certification, FARM applications, and direct outreach from DFNS and schools.
	There are no changes in meal prices this school year, and students who qualify for reduced-price meals will continue to receive meals at no cost. Breakfast: \$1.30 (All levels), Lunch: \$2.55 (Elementary), \$2.80 (Middle and High)
	Funds can be added to student meal accounts at no charge by bringing cash, check, or money order directly to school cafeteria managers. Payments to student meal accounts can be made through www.MySchoolBucks.com .
	Parents/guardians are responsible for school cafeteria account balances incurred by their student(s), and MCPS must collect unpaid school cafeteria charges. The Meal Payment Procedures, details payment responsibilities and school-based and DFNS communication to parents/guardians.

Action Required

- All Schools: Communicate menus and the Special Dietary Needs Form with families using applicable communication methods (handbooks, newsletters, ParentSquare, PTA notifications, school website, etc.). Please see Attachment A - Sample Food & Nutrition Language.
- Schools with In-Classroom Meals, Snack, or Supper: Ensure all school staff taking Maryland Meals For Achievement (MMFA)
 In-Classroom breakfast meal accountability have completed <u>Annual MMFA Training</u>. Additional program training information is
 forthcoming.
- Non-CEP Schools: Promote annual household submission of FARM applications with families using applicable communication methods as noted above. Ensure all households that may be eligible have completed the FARM application before October 9, 2025.

To receive this benefit, a **new FARMS application must be completed <u>every school year</u>. Please submit the online FARMS application through <u>www.MySchoolApps.com</u>. Only one application is needed for all students in a household.**

Meal Prices, Payment Policy, and Procedures for Non-CEP Schools

There are **no changes** in meal prices this school year. Funds can be added to student meal accounts at no charge by bringing cash, check, or money order directly to school cafeteria managers. Payments to student meal accounts can be made through www.MySchoolBucks.com.

Breakfast: \$1.30 (All levels), Lunch: \$2.55 (Elementary), \$2.80 (Middle and High)

Parents/guardians are responsible for school cafeteria account balances incurred by their student(s), and MCPS must collect unpaid school cafeteria charges. The <u>Meal Payment Policy</u> details payment responsibilities.
