- Must meet MISA requirements in Biology, HSA requirements NSL Government and PARCC requirements for Algebra 1 and English 10
- Need 75 SSL hours

## INTRODUCTION

## MARYLAND DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

The state of Maryland authorizes one diploma for all high school graduates, based on successful fulfillment of four categories of requirements: enrollment, course credit, Student Service Learning (SSL), and assessments developed or adopted by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), collectively referred to as the Maryland High School Assessments (MHSA). All requirements are summarized in the table below.

### College and Career Readiness

In 2013, the Maryland General Assembly passed the College and Career Readiness and College Completion Act (CCRCA), aimed at ensuring that all students are prepared for credit-bearing coursework in college and for living-wage careers. The CCRCA includes the requirement that all students be assessed for college and career readiness in English and mathematics by the end of Grade 11, using one of several college and career readiness assessments. Students who do not meet the college and career ready standard in English and mathematics by the end of Grade 11 will be required to enroll in a transistion course or other instructional opportunity during Grade 12, in preparation for reassessment. After completing the transition course or instructional opportunity, students must be reassessed by the end of Grade 12. School counselors and staff will work closely with students to determine the best assessment to take in Grade 11 as well as transition course options and reassessment that only for GRAGE (2) if necessary. ### Course Credits

Students shall be enrolled in Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) and have earned a minimum of 22 credits that include the following (unless a preapproved MCPS alternative is satisfied:

Enrollment

Students must satisfactorily complete four years of school beyond Grade 8. (For exceptions, see Alternatives to Four-Year Enrollment.) Beginning with students entering ninth grade for the first time in the 2014-2015 school year or later, each student shall enoil in a mathematics-based course each year the student attends a Maryland public high school, up to four years. This requirement is not waived for students enrolled in high school mathematics courses in middle school. MCPS courses that satisfy this requirement are published annually in this course bulletin. ## Maryland High School Comprehensive Assessment Program

Maryland High School Comprehensive Assessment Program are tests developed for or adopted by MSDE that are aligned with and measure a student's skills and knowledge as set forth in the content standards for specified courses. The term "MCAP" encompasses both the High School Assessment (HSA) developed for Maryland, tests developed by the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC), as well as other tests that MSDE may develop or adopt in the future. Students take these assessments as they complete the corresponding courses.





## What a Typical University of Maryland Freshman Looks Like (2019)

As prescribed by the Board of Regents, the university expects all applicants, at a MINIMUM, to have completed by graduation the following course work:

4 years of English

4 yrs. of Math, Alg. 1 & 2, Geometry

3 yrs. of Science in 2 areas, min. 2 labs experiences

3 yrs. of History or Social Science

2 yrs. of Foreign Language

The above criteria represent the minimum requirements for admission. Successful applicants typically exceed the minimum and include several honors and/or AP courses and additional academic electives.

Math is required each of the four years in high school!
